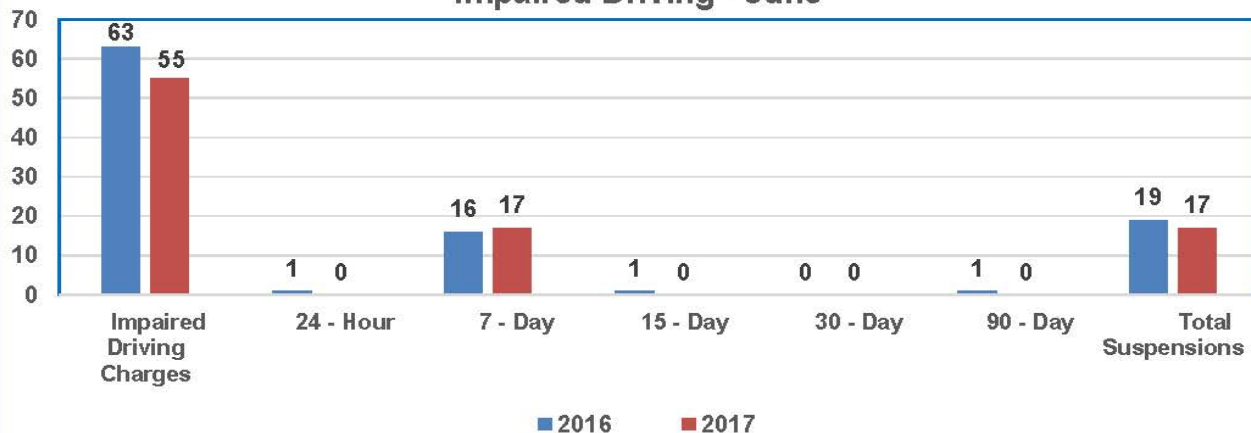

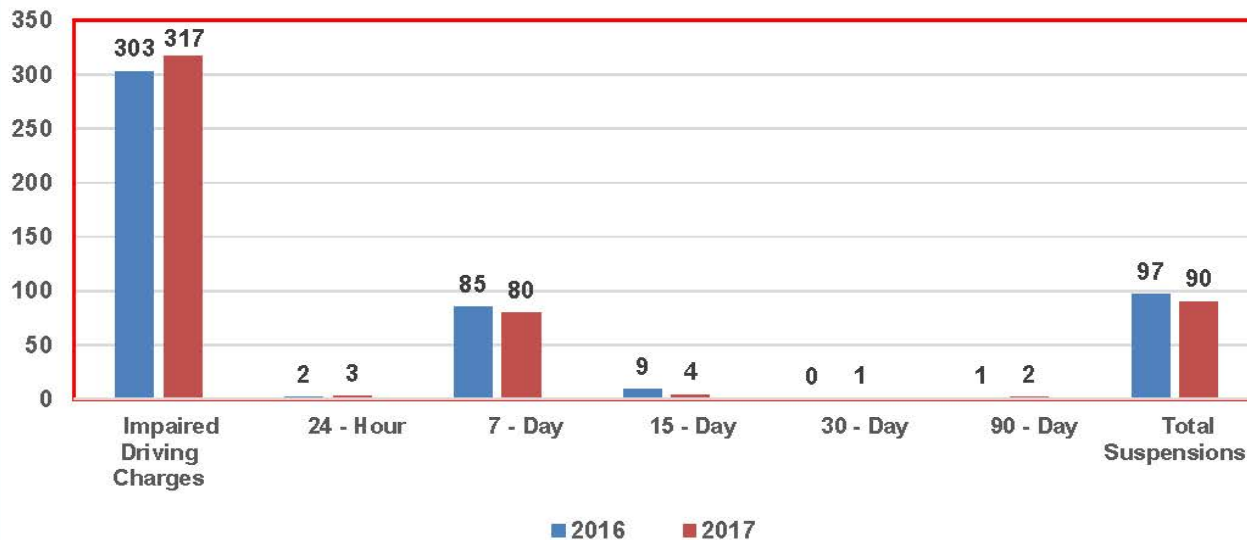
### Impaired Driving - June



### Impaired Driving - June

In June 2017, HRM Police charged fifty-five individuals with Impaired Driving, a 12.70% decrease and issued seventeen Impaired Driving suspensions, a -10.53% decrease compared to June 2016. The highest reading recorded in June on the breathalyzer was 290mg./100ml, more than three times the legal limit.

### Impaired Driving January - June

From Jan. 1st - June 30th 2017, HRM police charged three hundred and seventeen individuals with impaired driving, a +4.62% increase over the same period in 2016. Of those charged, ages were from 18 years to 72. The highest reading recorded on the breathalyzer was 350mg./100ml, more than four times the legal limit. An additional ninety Impaired Driving suspensions were issued, an -7.22% decrease when compared to Jan. 1st - June 30th, 2016.
