

2 Architectural Importance

- An excellent example of the Arts and Crafts architectural style
- Contains many characteristic elements of the style including a wood framed building with wooden shingle cladding, a medium pitched gabled roof with generously overhanging eaves, decorative brackets, and a covered front porch.
- The architecture of 59 Hawthorne is highly representative of the style

3 Significance of Architect

- Interior detailing suggest that the house was designed by Andrew Cobb
- Born in Brooklyn, New York
- Studied at Acadia University, Massachusetts Institute of Technology and the Ecole des Beaux Arts
- His residential designs were strongly influenced by the Arts and Crafts Movement

4 Architectural Merit

Construction Type or Building Technology

- 1 ½ storey wood-framed building
- Prominent front porch supported by columns set on low pedestals, sheathed with wooden shingles
- Overhanging eaves
- Wide barge boards
- Decorative brackets
