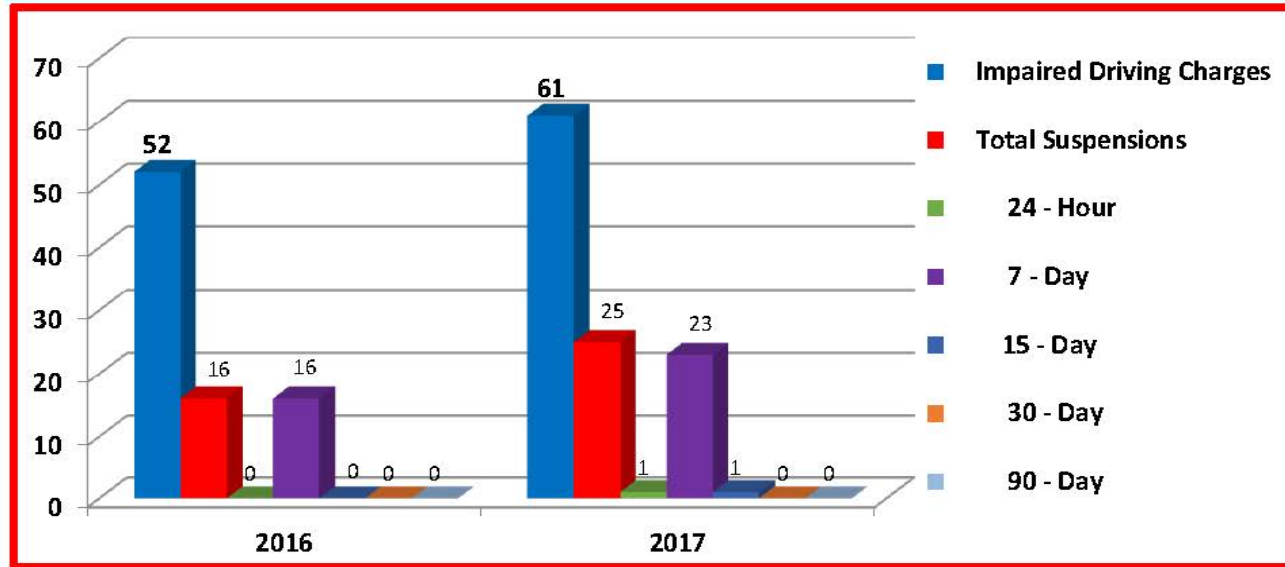

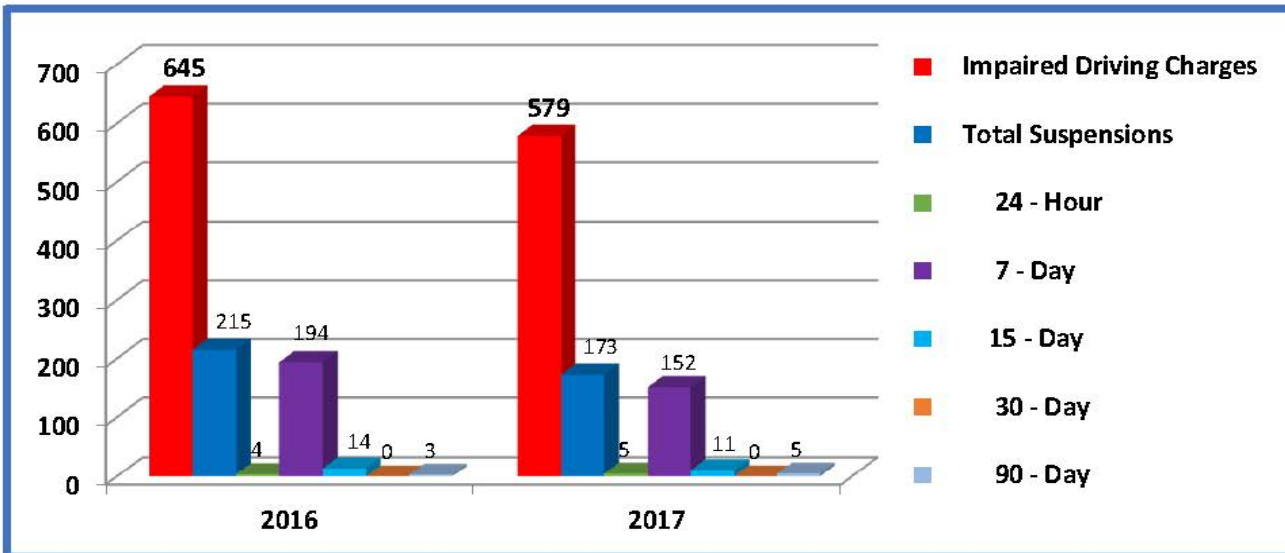


## Summary

**Impaired Driving - December**

In December 2017, HRM police charged 61 individuals with impaired driving, a +17% increase in impaired driving charges over December 2016. Impaired driving suspensions compared to December 2016 increased by 7 or +44%. HRM police identified 20 impaired drivers as a result of attending motor vehicle collisions. 34 impaired drivers were detected at traffic stops and 7 at checkpoints. For Suspensions, 9 drivers were identified by checkpoints, 13 through traffic stops, and 3 as a result of MVA's.

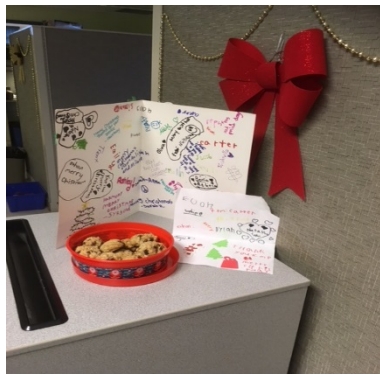
## Impaired Driving - January - December



## Impaired Driving January - December

From Jan. 1st - Dec. 31st 2017, HRM police charged 579 individuals with impaired driving, a -10% decrease in impaired driving charges and a -20% decrease in impaired driving suspensions when compared to the 2016 calendar year. 37 individuals were charged with impaired driving by drugs, a -20% decrease when compared to 2016. The highest recorded reading on the breathalyser was 390mg%.

On December 20, Wanted Wednesday (#WantedWednesdayHfx) launched on social media as a joint project between HRP's High-risk Enforcement Action Team (HEAT) Unit and PR Unit. The campaign uses the power of social media to feature people with outstanding arrest warrants for violent offences or a number of arrest warrants whom police have been unable to find. The goal is to locate and arrest each person who is profiled. Two people have been arrested since its launch.
