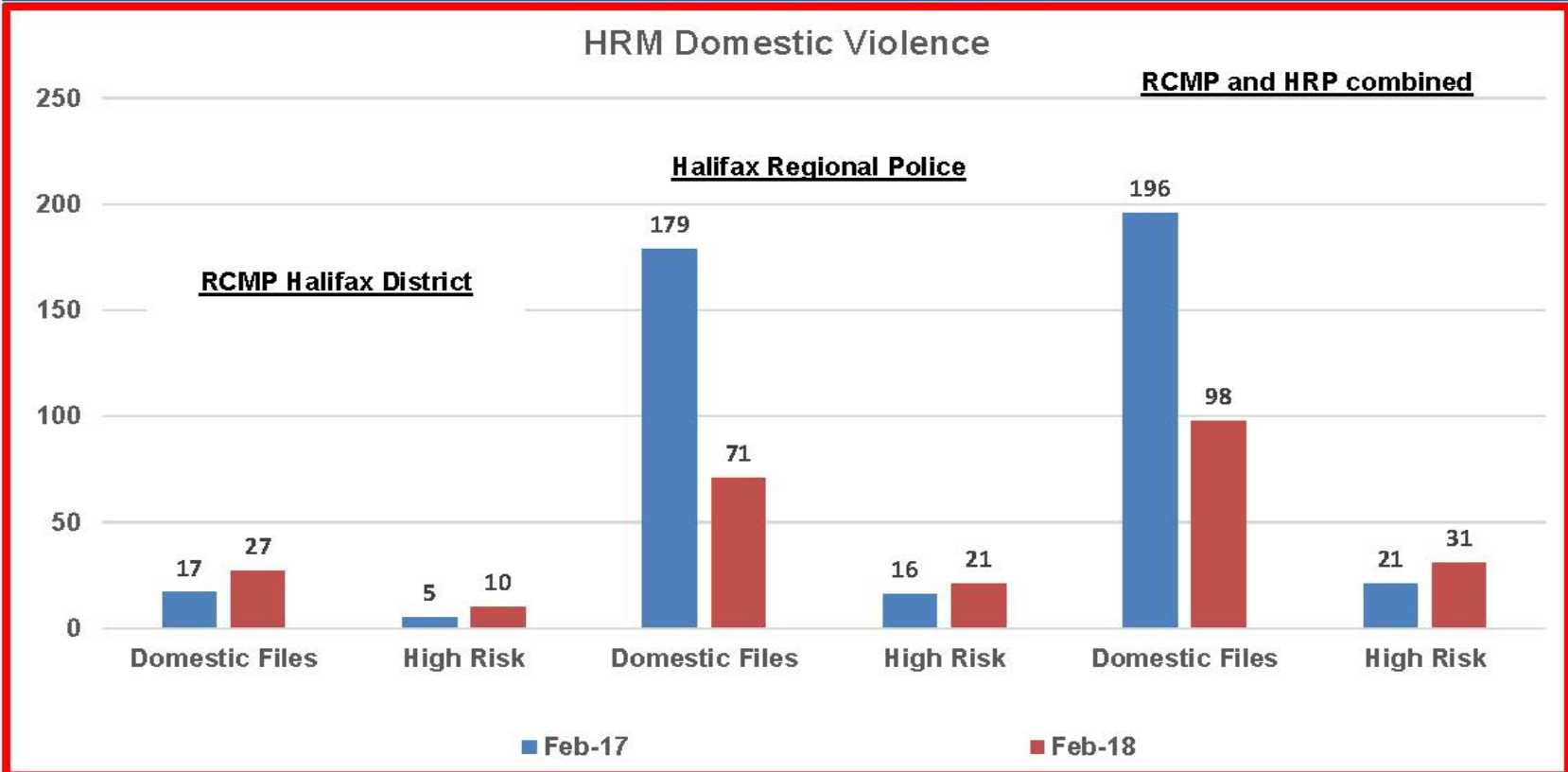




February 2017 - 2018 Comparison



HRM experienced an overall -50% decrease in domestic violence files in February 2018 when compared to February 2017 and a +48% increase in high risk files from 21 to 31. Halifax District had a +59% increase in domestic violence files during this period and a +100% increase in High Risk files from 5 to 10. Halifax Regional Police had a -60% decrease in domestic violence files in February 2018 when compared to February 2017 and a +31% increase in High Risk files from 16 to 21.
