

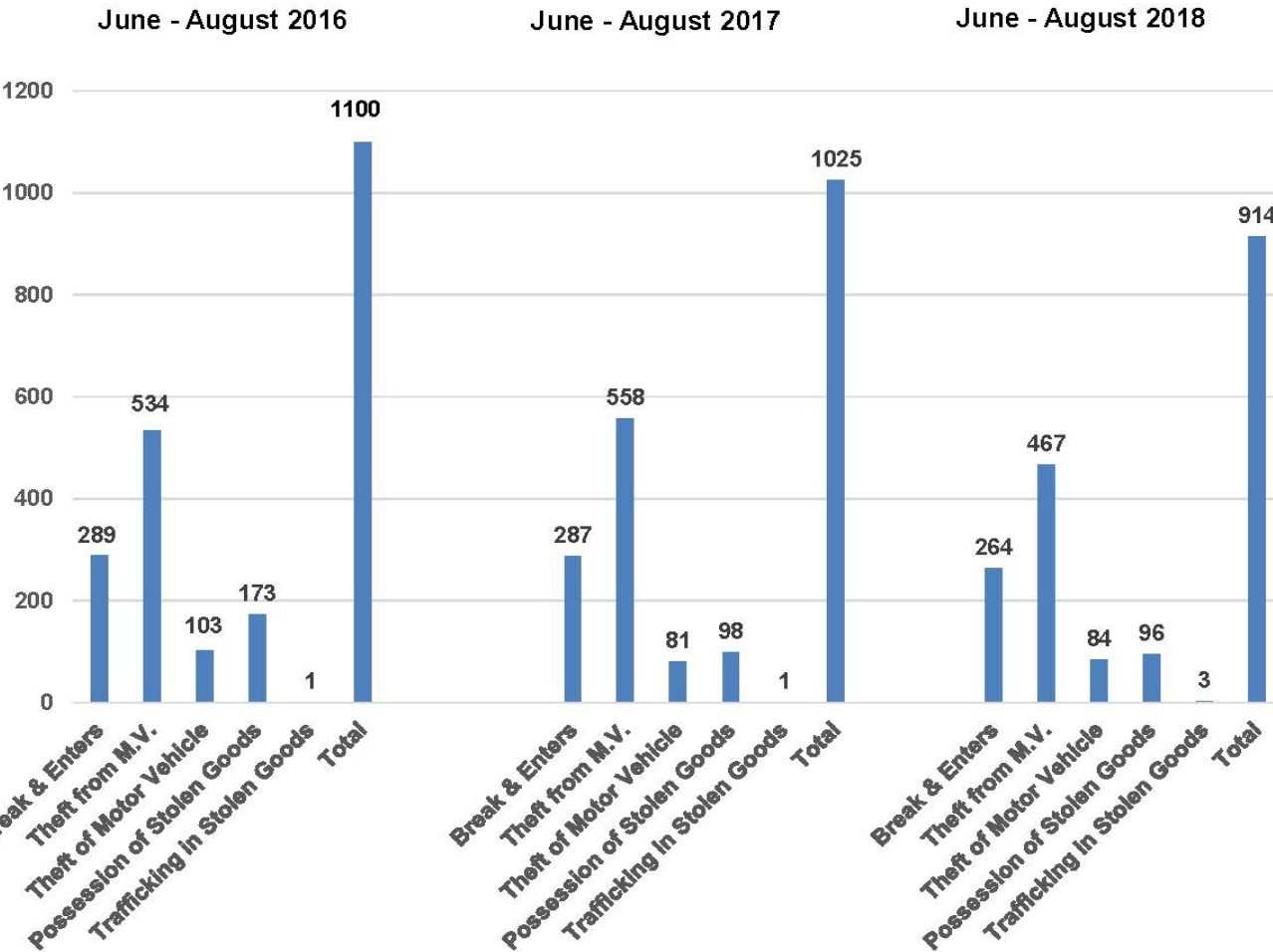

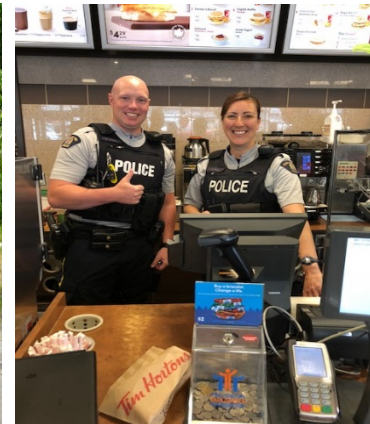


In the summer the general public are more inclined to leave windows open/doors unlocked during the warmer weather. From June to August, Halifax Regional Municipality (HRM) experienced a -11% decrease overall during that period in 2018 when compared to the same in 2017 and a -17% decrease when compared to 2016. Break & Enters decreased by -8% in 2018 when compared to 2017, Theft from Motor Vehicles decreased by -16%, Theft of Motor Vehicles increased by +4% and Possession of Stolen Goods decreased by -2%. A +10% of self generated calls, Foot Patrols, Checkpoints, Traffic Stops etc. was experienced within HRM during this period in 2018 when compared to 2017.

It was a very busy 2018 summer for Halifax District RCMP. There were many events across the entire District that Community Policing Officers attended including Canada Day Parades, Clam Harbour Days, Hope for Wild Life, Tim Hortons Camp, Dairy Queens Miracle Day and Bike Rodeo's just to name a few. Crime Reduction activities also took to the waters, beaches and the trails all over HRM. Officers patrolling the trails on side by sides partnering with Conservation Officers were ensuring users of the trail system in HRM were following Provincial Laws including the Off Highway Act, Fishing Regulations and the Trails Act and looking for Impaired Drivers. In total, 22 warnings, 6 charges, and a 24 hour suspension were issued.





HRP Sports Pals

This summer, officers teamed up with several communities in Halifax to offer HRP Sports Pals, a one-day soccer camp for youth.

Partnering with Dalhousie University Athletics, 10 officers, along with the head coach of The Dalhousie Tigers, taught soccer skills and drills to 40 youth. The youth participants were coordinated by Community Response Officers in Central, West and East Divisions.
