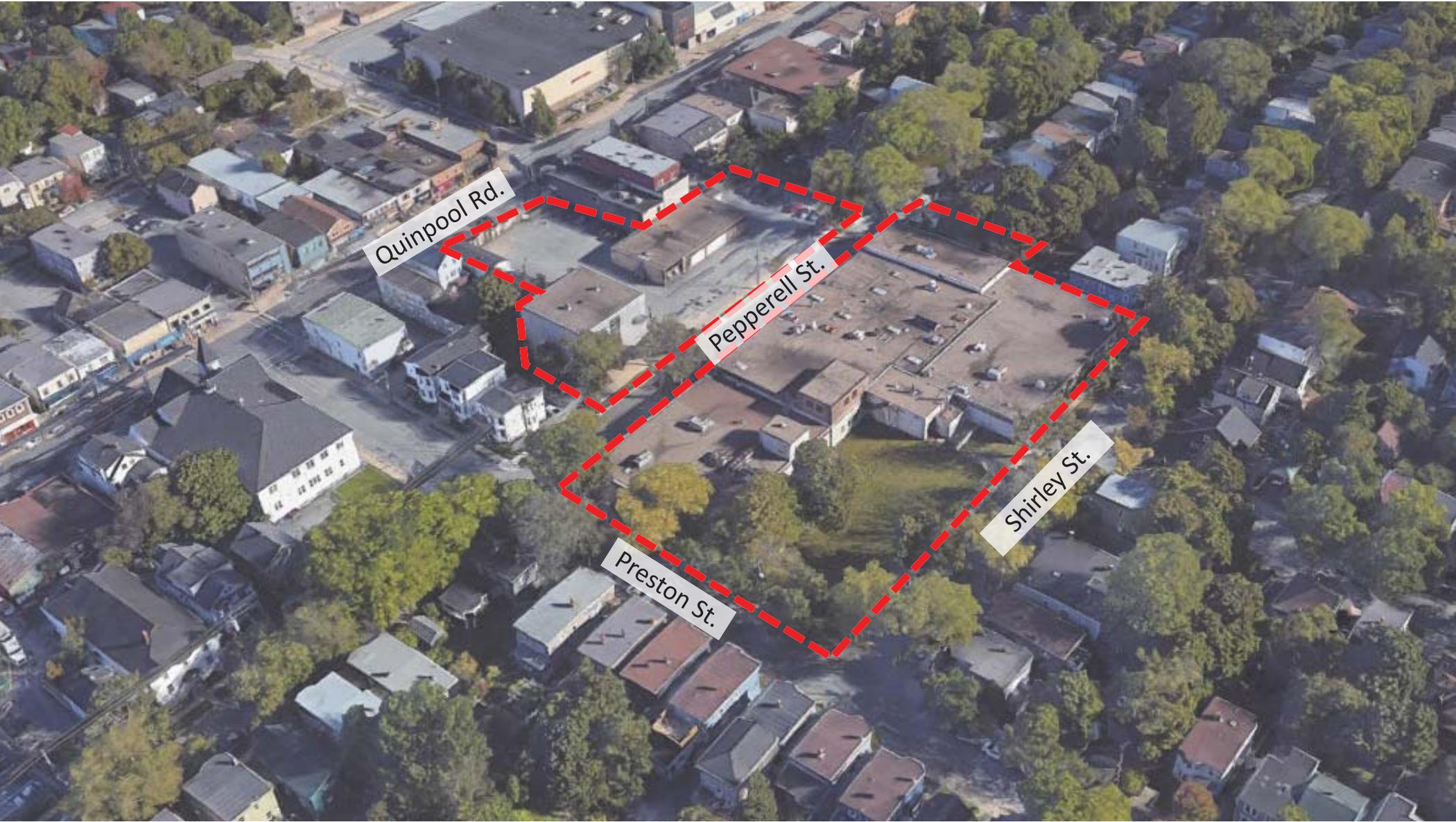

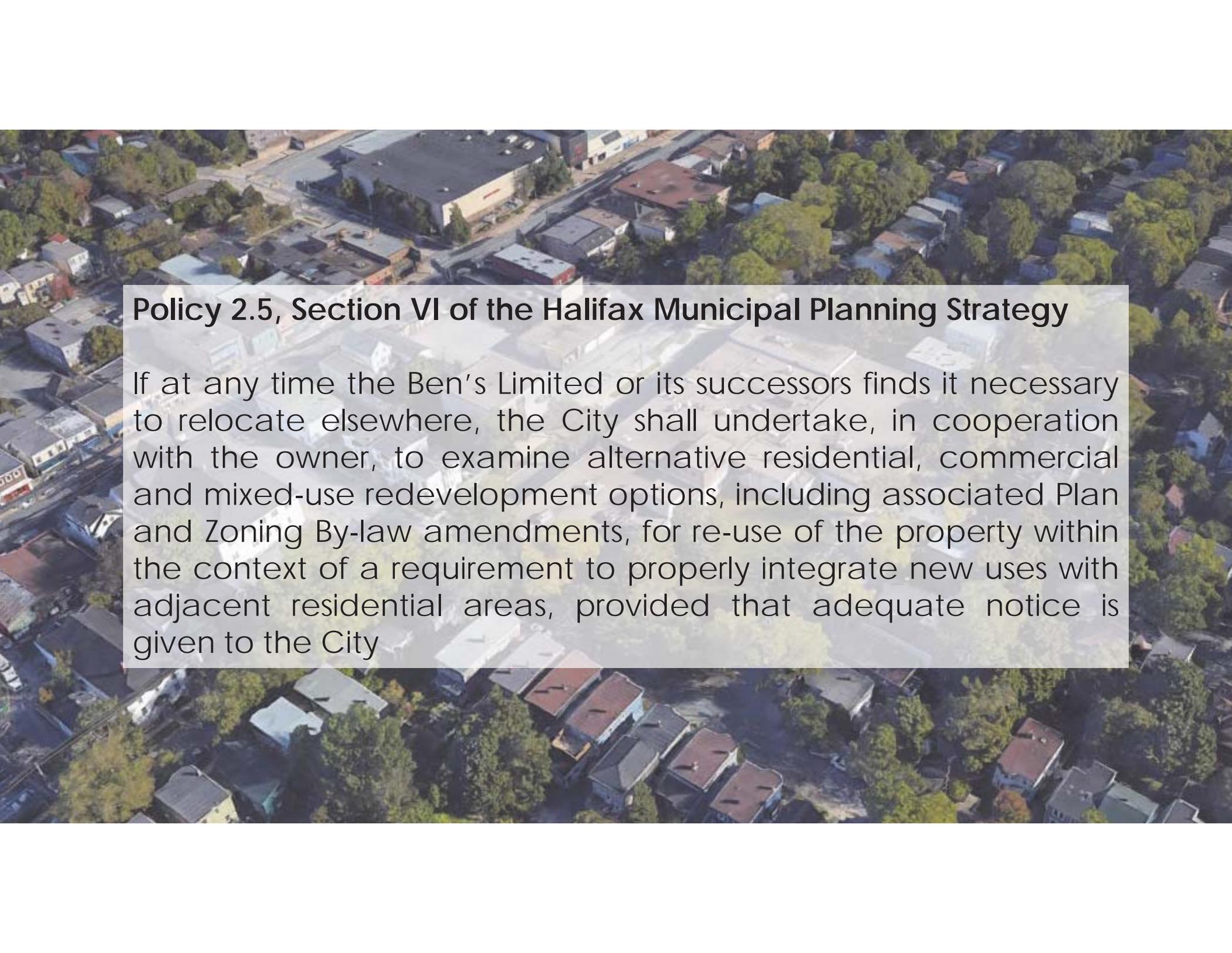

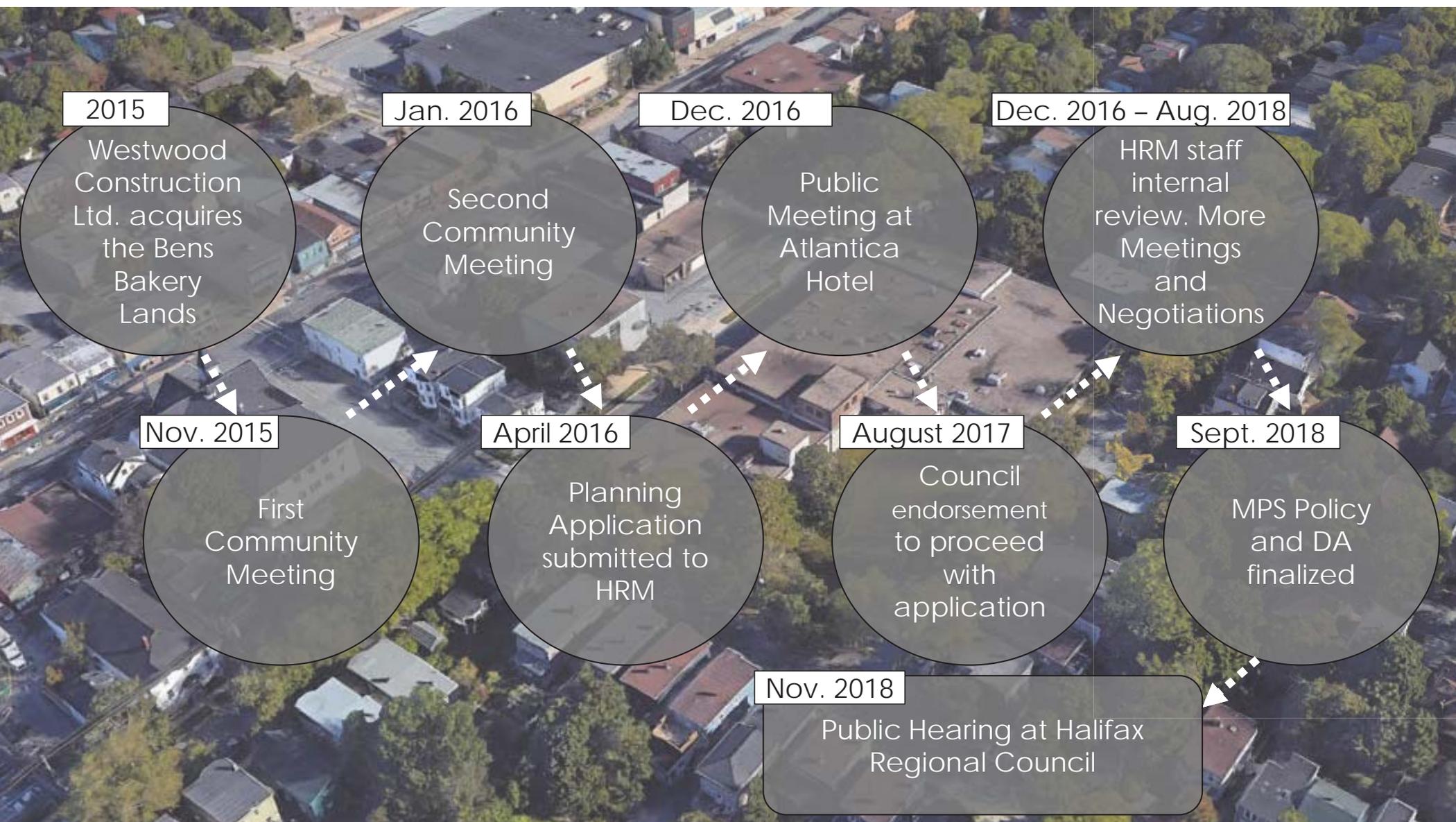

Policy 2.5, Section VI of the Halifax Municipal Planning Strategy

If at any time the Ben's Limited or its successors finds it necessary to relocate elsewhere, the City shall undertake, in cooperation with the owner, to examine alternative residential, commercial and mixed-use redevelopment options, including associated Plan and Zoning By-law amendments, for re-use of the property within the context of a requirement to properly integrate new uses with adjacent residential areas, provided that adequate notice is given to the City

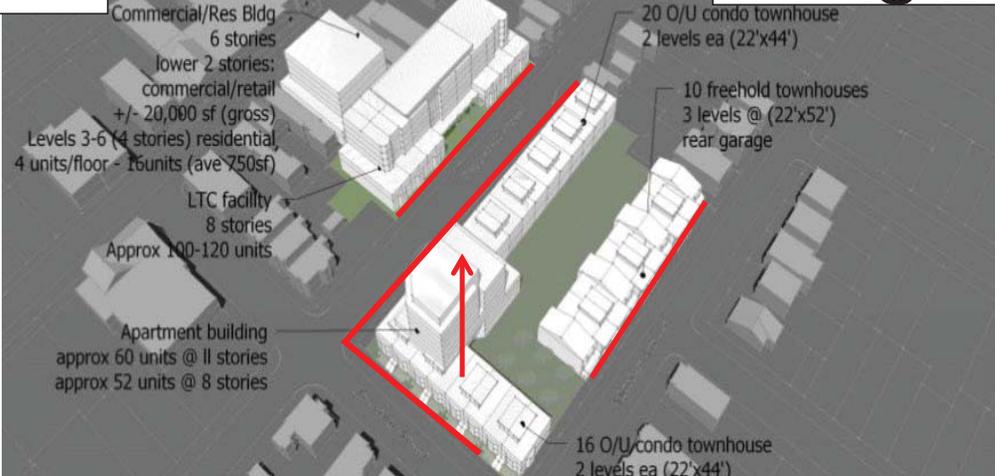

Major Emerging Themes:

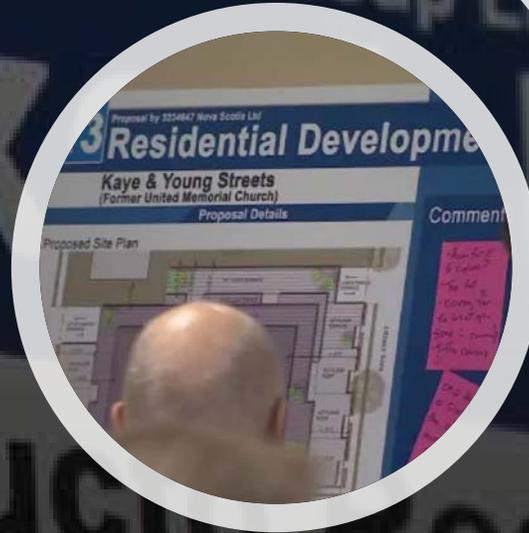
- Keep small scale on Shirley Street

- Increase sunlight exposure through building orientation and stepbacks

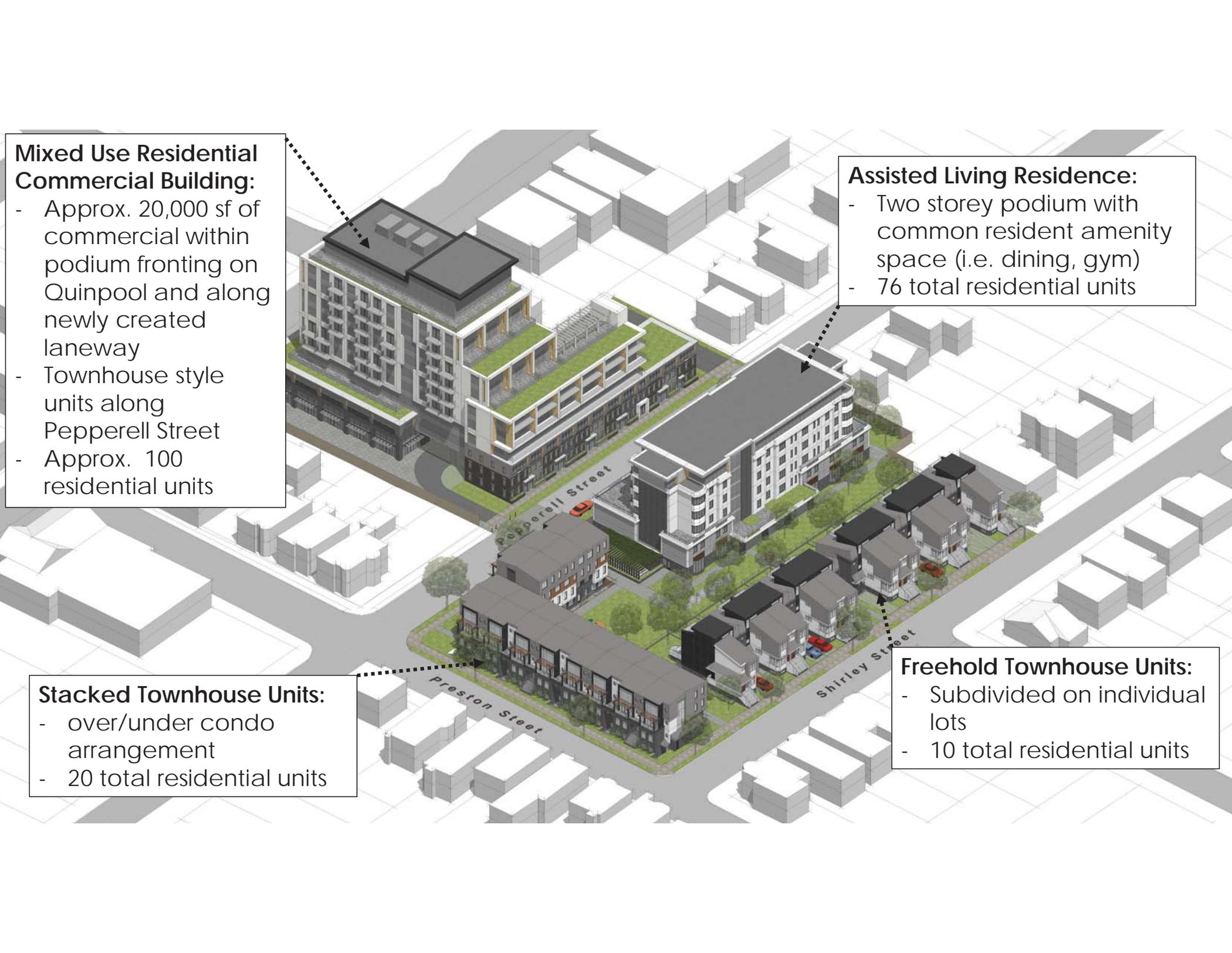
Community Engagement Event #3 December 2016, Atlantica Hotel

Held by HRM Planning & Development in conjunction with 17 other applications

What we heard:

- Several comments in general support of the overall proposal
- General support for the overall distribution of massing and height
- Feedback regarding certain setbacks and stepbacks and that they should be revised to allow for more appropriate transition. The current development proposal has responded to this feedback

Mixed Use Residential Commercial Building:

- Approx. 20,000 sf of commercial within podium fronting on Quinpool and along newly created laneway
- Townhouse style units along Pepperell Street
- Approx. 100 residential units

Assisted Living Residence:

- Two storey podium with common resident amenity space (i.e. dining, gym)
- 76 total residential units

Stacked Townhouse Units:

- over/under condo arrangement
- 20 total residential units

Freehold Townhouse Units:

- Subdivided on individual lots
- 10 total residential units
