HRM Blasting By-law, Property Damage & Nuisance, 2,500 Blasts per Year

Objectives of the By-law

- Regulates Impacts of Blasting
 - Establish "thresholds" & involve the relevant professionals in blast design and monitoring
- Provide information to residents for claim settlement

 Monitoring standards
- Does NOT address Occupational Health & Safety
- Does NOT apply to Quarries



Blasting By-law Key Provisions

Threshold Limits for Vibration and Air Blast Limits

Limit for Vibration Based on Safe Limit to Prevent Cracking in Plaster Walls

Air Blast Limit Based on Nuisance 128 dBa



How Much is 128 dB?

Noise Level	Pressure Ratio	<u>Example</u>
0 dB	1	Lowest Measurable
70 dB	3,000	Normal Conversation
80 dB	10,000	Busy City Street
100 dB	100,000	Shouting at Close Range
120 dB	1 Million	Loud Rock Concert
128 dB	2.5 Million	Blasting Bylaw Limit
140 dB	10 Million	Drywall can crack

Blasting By-law Key Provisions – cont'd.

Blast Monitoring Standards

Requires "Qualified Monitor" to Be an Engineer or Geoscientist

Limit Weight of Explosive Charge Based on Distance to Nearest Structure

- Minimizes Effects on Schools, Hospitals, Wells, Septic Fields, Utilities
- Pre-Blast Area Based on Maximum Weight of Explosive Used



Blasting By-law Key Provisions – cont'd. Easier Access to Pre-blast Survey **Better Notification Dedicated Inspector Special Powers of the Inspector** e.g. – Heritage Properties, Public Meetings, **Compliance Monitoring**
