

[Access-A-Bus](#) provides door-to-door transit service for persons who are unable to use the conventional system due to disability. Last

month, Regional Council approved the adoption of the Access-A-Bus Continuous Improvement Service Plan which includes investments in new technology, achieving a more adaptable service and the introduction of integrated trips, all contributing to a more efficient, accessible service for passengers. BURNSIDE CONNECTOR ANNOUNCEMENT



I was pleased to attend the announcement of \$86.5 million in Federal funding for the Burnside Connector project. This extension of the 107 Highway will

mean more efficient transportation for cargo, cars and buses and provide opportunities for active transportation links as well. The Province has also committed funds to this project and a report will be coming to Regional Council this month to discuss entering into a Memorandum of Understanding and cost-sharing agreement with the Province for a portion of the project.

TAXI LEGISLATION AMENDMENTS

Regional Council has approved amendments to the By-law and Administrative Order that govern taxis in our municipality. The new amendments aim to address the challenges of safety, zoning, supply and demand and accessibility. The amendments included making 600 more licenses available, eliminating the zoning regulations that confined taxi's to one particular area and making driver training, GPS and debit and credit card machines mandatory.

Feedback from residents and information captured from an extensive consultant's report were used to support and guide the proposed taxi service improvements.

Municipal staff have also been directed to proceed with preparing amendments to existing Vehicles for Hire legislation and to explore opportunities to regulate transportation network companies, like Uber and Lyft, that may choose to operate in the municipality.



GRAY ARENA UPDATE



As part of the process for disposing of surplus properties, Regional Council has re-categorized the Gray Arena to maximize

efficient use of a four-acre site and promote opportunities for re-development.

Deemed surplus in 2014, the building was originally categorized as a Community Interest property. The property has been re-categorized as “Ordinary Sale” and can be sold at market value which will provide opportunities for investment in other municipal priorities. COGSWELL DISTRICT DESIGN PLAN



After extensive public consultation, the 90% construction design plan for the Cogswell District was approved by Regional Council Tuesday February 26th. The approved design plan has accessibility, public art and commemorative features, parks and open spaces, multi-use paths, streetscapes and a transit hub for the new neighbourhood.

A detailed land use policy, including finalizing the rules that will guide the design and use of buildings in the Cogswell District, will be reviewed and considered in the coming months as part of the Municipal Planning Strategy (MPS) and Land Use By-law (LUB) amendment process. The goal is to complete the process well in advance of the sale of the first development block. 
