


Springtime brings milder weather and commences the road construction season. Now that the

QUINPOOL ROAD FREE ON-STREET PARKING SPACES



75 **free**, on-street parking spaces (shown in **purple** on the above map) are now available along the closed section of Quinpool Road for the duration of the CN Rail Bridge Rehabilitation Project. These spaces have no time restrictions; however, you must adhere to the Motor Vehicle Act wherein **vehicles**

are not permitted to park on-street for more than 24 hours.

The spaces are available **free of charge** and are located between the Armdale Roundabout and Horseshoe Island Park.

Entrepreneur Mr. David Backman is starting a ferry service across the North West Arm from the Dingle floating dock to the public floating dock at the end of Jubilee Road. The Pontoon boat can hold 10 passengers plus the Captain and, has space for 4 bikes.

The service will be offered during peak commute hours: 6:00 a.m. - 10:00 a.m. and 3:30 p.m. - 6:00 p.m. on a 15-20-minute rotation. Cost will be \$4 per crossing. Service will start as soon as the wharf is in place at the end of Jubilee Road. For more information, call **902.425.1930**.

"RAMADHAN KAREEM" - HOLY FASTING MONTH COMMENCES

The evening of May 5th marks the first day of Ramadhan, when Muslims begin the spiritual journey of fasting throughout the holy month: May 6th to June 4th, 2019 in the Gregorian calendar or Ramadhan 1st to the 29th, 1440 in the Hijri calendar.

During Ramadhan, adult Muslims, who are healthy and capable, fast for the whole month of Ramadhan (approx. 29 days). Fasting starts before the dawn prayer (Fajr) at around 3:30 am and ends with the sunset prayer (Maghreb) around 8:30 pm in Halifax.

During the fasting hours, Muslims give up food, drink, smoke, and everything that requires oral, nasal, or interveinal intake including medication (if they can change the time for medication intake).

If they are unable to fast, but can make a monetary donation, they are required to feed 60 poor people during the month of Ramadhan to participate in this spiritual journey. Muslims in Halifax donate to Feed Nova Scotia, women's and men's shelters as well as other community organizations.

There are over 8,000 Muslims in Halifax.

Muslims in Halifax speak Arabic,
 English, French, Urdu, Persian, Yoruba,


Hausa, and other languages. Arabic is the second most spoken language in Halifax.

- Muslims in Halifax come from all over the world.
- There are more than 6 mosques in Halifax where Muslim go to pray.
- Muslims pray 5 times a day (roughly between 4 am and 11 pm).
- Muslims do not have to go to Mosques for mass prayers, they can pray anywhere, individually or in groups.


2019 / 20 BUDGET APPROVED!



Regional Council, with the urban tax rate reduced by 0.3 per cent, has approved a 2.3 per cent increase to the average household tax bill (about +\$50) this year. For the average home in Halifax, the municipal portion of the tax bill is \$1,967.

This increase is less than the growth in personal income per capita (2.5 per cent) and slightly more than inflation (2.1 per cent).

HALIFAX WEST COMMUNITY COUNCIL UPDATES


On April 9th, Halifax & West Community Council approved the following motions:

<u>Case 22005</u> – To give First Reading for the Internal Residential Conversions in the Peninsula West Area 1 Schedule of the Land Use By-Law for Halifax Peninsula and set a public hearing for May 21st. The image below shows Area 1.



Case 20577: That Regional Council give First Reading and schedule a joint public hearing on amendments to the Municipal Planning Strategy for Halifax and Land Use By-law for Halifax Peninsula, and a proposed development agreement to enable an eightstorey building (plus penthouse) on the lands fronting Robie Street, Cunard Street, and Compton Avenue, Halifax.

This matter was before Regional Council on Tuesday, April 30th. First Reading was given, and a joint public hearing for May 21st.



7037 MUMFORD ROAD – PROPOSAL FOR 22-STOREY RESIDENTIAL / COMMERCIAL DEVELOPMENT



A development permit has been granted by Planning and Development staff for 7037 Mumford Road. The permit is for a 22-storey, 120-unit residential development with commercial on the ground floor.

The current zoning on the property allows for commercial and high-density residential development, so it is considered "as-of-right" development. Since this is a permitted

use under the existing Municipal Planning Strategy (MPS) and Land Use By-Law (LUB), no public information meeting nor public hearing are required, and the matter will not be presented to either Community Council or Regional Council.
