

## ADAPTIVE CYCLING AVAILABLE AT EMERA OVAL

In the summer you can borrow inline/roller skates, bikes, scooters, plasma cars, helmets and protective gear. Adapted equipment available includes:

- Hand Bikes
- [Alinker](#)
- Double/single size adult tricycles
- Children’s tricycles with push bar
- [Mobi](#) (low to ground tricycle)
- Sledge on wheels
- [Hippo Campe](#) (large wheel bikes).



All users of the Emera Oval must wear a helmet in the summer. Rentals are **FREE** with a valid Government issued photo ID.

Accessibility for visitors to the Emera Oval includes:

- Accessible parking (on Cogswell Street)
- One accessible washroom
- Wheelchairs allowed on concrete/ice (in outside lane only)

Avoid wasting water by keeping a water jar by the sink. We waste over 2,000 gallons of water a year by waiting for tap water to heat up. Fill a jar with the cool water while you are waiting and use that water for plants, cleaning or drinking.

[HalifACT 2050](#): Acting on Climate Together is a long-term climate change plan to reduce emissions and help our communities adapt. HalifACT 2050 is about what we do together to address climate change over the next 30 years.



The HalifACT 2050 team will be hosting a number of [pop-ups](#) over the summer with staff on hand to answer your questions about our progress in the development of a long-term climate action plan. I encourage you to [take our climate action survey](#).

**Project Timeline**

- Summer-Fall 2019**  
Pop-up engagement sessions with the public, BAU, modelling low carbon scenarios to determine which is suitable for the municipality.
- Fall-Winter 2019**  
Present scenario and low carbon options, formal public participation, draft technical paper that will shape the HalifACT action plan.
- Winter 2020**  
Finalize technical paper that will shape the HalifACT action plan.
- Spring 2020**  
Present proposed HalifACT action plan to Regional Council for review and approval.



## IMPORTANT NOTICE: HALIFAX TRANSIT SERVICE CHANGES

On **November 25, 2019**, Halifax Transit will introduce large-scale service changes in Sackville, Bedford, Dartmouth, and Halifax Mainland South as part of the [Moving Forward Together Plan](#). These service changes are outlined in Halifax Transit’s [2019/20 Annual Service Plan](#), and were approved by Regional Council in April 2019.

The impact to District 9 will include the following:

5	Route 5 Springvale will be replaced by New Route 26 Springvale
15	Route 15 will be replaced at Peak only by New Rural Route 415 Purcells Cove
25	New Route 25 Governors Brook
26	New Route 26 Springvale will terminate at Mumford Terminal
127	Existing Route 32 Cowie Hill Express will be renumbered to 127 Cowie Hill Express

**Route 29 Barrington:** will be adjusted in the outbound direction only, to avoid entering Mumford Terminal due to capacity issues. The route will instead stop on Mumford Road.

**Route 415 Purcells Cove:** existing route will be amended to terminate at Mumford Terminal rather than continue to Bayers Road Shopping Centre.

**Route 5 Chebucto:** will be discontinued and partly replaced by new Route 26 Springvale.

**Route 15 Purcells Cove:** existing route will be discontinued and replaced by new Rural Route 415 Purcells Cove.

**Route 25 Governors Brook** • This new route will provide service between the subdivision of Governors Brook and Mumford Terminal via

Williams Lake Road and Purcells Cove Road. • This new route replaces service during the off-peak and weekend periods on Purcells Cove Road, inbound from Williams Lake Road, where Route 15 service during the off-peak period has been discontinued.

**Route 26 Springvale:** new route will provide service between Springvale and Mumford Terminal. • This route will follow the same routing as the existing Route 5 Chebucto but will not continue beyond Mumford Terminal to Downtown Halifax.



**FUNDING AWARDED TO BRIGHT IDEAS PROJECTS TO IMPROVE CROSSWALK SAFETY**



HRM has awarded funding for bright ideas projects from community members as

part of the annual Heads Up Halifax campaign to help improve crosswalk safety across our region. Eleven proposals were submitted and eligible to be considered by the evaluation panel. Awards have been granted for five successful proposals submitted by the following four organizations:

- **Ecology Action Centre:**
  - \$5,000 towards the Safety for All education effort for newcomers.
- **Saint Mary’s University Entrepreneurship Centre:**
  - \$5,000 towards the coordination and facilitation of a crosswalk safety hackathon for students / youth and community members.
- **Nova Scotia Community College:**
  - \$5,000 towards the development of a cross block lighting prototype.
- **Crosswalk Safety Society of Nova Scotia (2 projects):**
  - \$5,000 towards the creation of fridge magnets
  - \$1,000 towards the development and distribution of a brochure

**SPRYFIELD FARMERS MARKET**

Four years ago, the Spryfield Community Market Society launched the Spryfield Farmers Market supporting local entrepreneurs, not-for-profits and new-comers. This year, they welcomed a new Market Manager, Patti Clark, to continue to develop the vibrant and inclusive Farmers Market. Knowing that a strong community starts with the health and wellness of its members, Patti decided to launch a [Market Tokens program](#).

The mission of the [Market Tokens program](#), partnered with The Family Resource Institute (FRI) - which operates the Food Bank at St. Paul's United Church - is to spread access to fresh local food. The tokens are purchased by credit or debit cards and treated as cash in the Market’s space. Fundraising enables the tokens to be offered at no cost to community members who rely on food banks. This anonymous service helps individuals while they work toward self-sustainability.

The great news is that the CN Bridge Rehabilitation project on Quinpool Road is on schedule and work may be done by mid-August. I sincerely thank all residents for the helpful suggestions offered on how to improve traffic flow, safety for pedestrians, cyclists and drivers.

Many may think that the installation of traffic calming speed humps on MacDonald Street is a result of the CN project; however, this was a previous request submitted through our Traffic Calming process that began last year. Four speed humps have been installed based on a traffic study that showed 85 per cent of drivers were traveling too fast.


