<b>Subject: 5925 Spring Garden Road, 1538 Carlton Street and 1540 Carlton Street - Potential Inclusion in Heritage Registry</b>		
<b>Motion for Heritage Advisory Committee to Consider:</b>  That the Heritage Advisory Committee recommend that Halifax Regional Council request a staff report examining the potential for including 5925 Spring Garden Road, 1538 Carlton Street and 1540 Carlton Street by Camp Hill Cemetery in the Registry of Heritage Property for the Halifax Regional Municipality.  <b>Reason:</b> Carlton Victorian Streetscape is a valuable example of a Victorian residential street. The streetscape never extended to these buildings and has left them as a peripheral zone under threat of loss. These homes add to the streetscape and need to be kept. Halifax continues its loss of built heritage at an alarming rate as pointed out in a recent HRM staff report. These buildings represent unique Victorian architecture of Halifax and with their preservation will enforce the Carlton streetscape and add to the economic tourism value of Nova Scotia.		
<b>Outcome Sought:</b>  A motion from Halifax Regional Council requesting as staff report to examine the potential inclusion of 5925 Spring Garden Road, 1538 Carlton Street and 1540 Carlton Street, in the Registry of Heritage Property for the Halifax Regional Municipality.
