**Title: United Nations Climate Change Conference** 

#### ISSUE

Request by Councillor Zurawski to attend the United Nations Climate Change Conference, December 2 to 13, 2019 in Madrid, Spain.

#### BACKGROUND

The twenty-fifth session of the Conference of the Parties to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (COP25), also known as the United Nations Climate Change Conference, will be held at <u>IFEMA - Feria de Madrid</u> in Madrid, Spain, from December 2 to 13, 2019. The conference was originally planned for Santiago, Chile but was recently moved to Madrid. The Presidency of the Government of Chile remains the host, but the conference will be held with logistical support from the Government of Spain. The United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC) secretariat is working with both the Government of Chile and the Government of Spain to make the necessary arrangements to relocate the conference on short notice, so some conference-specific detail is not yet available.

#### DISCUSSION

#### **Purpose of COP25**

The UN Climate Change Secretariat (the secretariat), using event such as COP25 as a catalyst, aims to promote global climate action in several areas, one of which is:

• Convening climate stakeholders – from governments, **cities**, states, business, civil society and multilateral organizations, to share best practices, facilitate collaboration, and inspire enhanced action around key themes.



Halifax Regional Municipality PO Box 1749, Halifax, Nova Scotia Canada B3J 3A5 The secretariat encourages partnerships with mutually beneficial objectives, and financial or inkind contribution from all stakeholders, to support the secretariat's work. The financial or in-kind contribution (skills, human resources, tools, technology, materials and equipment) will increase the secretariat's capacity and resources to support developing countries to undertake the transformation required to meet the goals of the Paris Agreement, carry out strategic outreach to promote climate action among stakeholders such as the public, cities, regions, business and civil society and to deploy technology and innovation.

In this light, the secretariat welcomes partnership proposals which address one of the six focus areas below:

- Finance: mobilizing public and private sources of finance to drive decarbonization of all priority sectors and advance resilience;
- Energy Transition: accelerating the shift away from fossil fuels and towards renewable energy, as well as making significant gains in energy efficiency;
- Industry Transition: transforming industries such as Oil and Gas, Steel, Cement, Chemicals and Information Technology;
- Nature-Based Solutions: Reducing emissions, increasing sink capacity and enhancing resilience within and across forestry, agriculture, oceans and food systems, including through biodiversity conservation, leveraging supply chains and technology;
- Cities and Local Action: Advancing mitigation and resilience at urban and local levels, with a focus on new commitments on low-emission buildings, mass transport and urban infrastructure; and resilience for the urban poor;
- Resilience and Adaptation: advancing global efforts to address and manage the impacts and risks of climate change, particularly in those communities and nations most vulnerable.

The six action portfolios have been prioritized by the UN Secretary-General, and are recognized as having high potential to curb greenhouse gas emissions and increased global action on adaptation and resilience. The secretariat places a high priority on developing relationships with cities around the world and has a relationship building mandate not only among cities but also between NGOs and cities. In addition, the secretariat aims to assist in providing financing structures for meeting climate change targets and outcomes.

Councillor Zurawski has proposed that this conference is an opportunity for HRM to build relationships with COP25 and its partners, leading to future exploration on how the municipality can leverage and incorporate those relationships into action. Exploring these opportunities may help to support the implementation of Halifact2050.

#### Cost Estimates

**Accommodations Estimate: \$3,000** - Because of the recent relocation of the conference to Madrid, detailed accommodation information is not yet available on the conference web site. In the meantime, as estimate of accommodation costs in the geographic area of the conference for that period (from a travel web site) is roughly \$3,000 (low of \$2,500 to highs over \$5,000). The actual costs will depend on the type and location of accommodation chosen.

**Flight Estimate: \$1,000** - Estimated cost for Flight to Madrid for the period from December 2 to 13 (according to a travel web site) start at a low of approximately \$1,000. This is just an estimate and will change based on specific departure/return dates, timing of flights, stopovers, etc.

**Meal Estimate: \$770** – Estimated meal costs are based on the HRM per diem rate - \$55 per day x 14 days = \$770

**Conference Registration: \$330** - Estimate is based on initial information provided when the conference was to be hosted in Chile. There is no updated information regarding registration costs on the Madrid web site, so it is assumed that this cost has not changed.

#### Estimated Total Cost: \$5,030
