<b>Subject: 1479 Birmingham Street Potential Inclusion in Heritage Registry</b>		
<b>Motion for the Heritage Advisory Committee to Consider:</b>		
<b>That the Heritage Advisory Committee recommends that Halifax Regional Council request a staff report examining the potential for including 1479 Birmingham Street in the Registry of Heritage Property for the Halifax Regional Municipality.</b>		
<b>Reason:</b> 1479 Birmingham Street according to the McAlpine's Directory was site to the Halifax Grammar School in 1878. The principal of the school (Rev. Gilpin) lived in the mansion next door facing Spring Garden Road. The building also was part of the historic Mills Brothers Shop as the men's ware department. The building retains much of its Victorian character and is one of the few remaining buildings left of the original north blocks of Schmidville.		
<b>Outcome Sought:</b> A motion from Halifax Regional Council requesting as staff report to examine the potential inclusion of 1479 Birmingham Street, in the Registry of Heritage Property for the Halifax Regional Municipality.
