On Motion the opinion of His Honor the Recorder in writing is required as to whether the City Council have power to close said Street.

The City Council next proceed to take up the Truck and Hack Ordinance for a Third reading. The same is read.

On Motion the 2nd Clause is struck out and the following resolution (18th) introduced

Resolved that the words, "or driver of a truck" be inserted following the word "Truckman" in the 11th Clause, moved by Alderman Pugsley seconded by Alderman Owens which on being put is lost.

The following resolution is next introduced

Resolved that the name of "Africville" applied to a place 3 1/2 Miles from the Starting point in the Scale of Truckmens distances be changed to "Ashley". Moved by Aldermen Cogswell seconded by Alderman Jennings which on being put there appeared for the same 6 against 6 and there being an equality of votes His Worship the Mayor is called upon for his casting vote and gives it in favour of resolution.
