The Secy was instructed to transmit the Return of teaching days for the City Schools for the half year ending April 30 1867 to the Superintendent of Education J H Rand Esq

The Secretary reported that the Yard of St. Johns School was in a very bad condition and that the fences on the West side require immediate attention

He was directed to address a Committee to Rev P. G. McGregor Secy of the Trustees of St Johns College on the subject

Messrs Hogan & Sons Tender for wood fuel for the City Schools at \$375 per cord was accepted. The Secy was ordered to inform them of the above and have the supply required - provided immediately -

The Secy was authorized to employ a trustworthy Truckman to be employed for coal necessary for the schools requiring it
