to the legal adviser of the Board he reports
under date, March 31, as follows:-

Sir, "I beg to transmit to you the draft
of lease of the Russell St School submitted
to me some time ago for inspection

I consider that the interests of
the Board will be fully protected under
a lease in the words of the draft provided
that the words 'reasonable wear and
tear and inevitable accidents or casual-
ties by the elements excepted' be
added at the conclusion of the clause
requiring the premises to be delivered
up to the lessor in the same condition as
they shall be in at the completion of the
repairs provided for in the lease

I would therefore advise that
such emendation be made before the
lease be accepted by the Board
