2. That on the closing of the Agricola St. School building, Mrs. Card, the janitrix, be transferred to the janitorship of the new building on Compton Avenue, and that the Committee receive applications for the janitorship of the new buildings on Aqueduct and LeMarchant Streets.

3. In regard to the 3rd clause of the report of this Committee submitted by them on the 2nd inst, and referred back for further enquiry, they beg leave to report, that, on investigation they find that, without considering whether the amount for alterations to Brunswick St. School could be charged to Construction account, the Preliminaries on which such expense could be so placed not having been observed, the amount will now be payable from ordinary revenue.

4. In regard to the amount of \$700 for Agricola School included in amount of debentures recently issued the Committee are of opinion that this was in accordance with the intention at the time; the expenditure was authorized by the Government (on 30 Aug 1883) but temporarily from "general account" funding
