### Technical Education

On motion of Commr. Parker and W. W. W. permission to use Morris St School for Technical Classes was granted.

On motion of Commrs. W. W. W. and Colwell the matter of lighting the vacant room was referred to Supt. Hall to arrange.

The Supervisor was directed to confer with Mr J. T. Wilson and Mr. Sexton for the use of Assembly hall at different hours.
