- 2 They submit extract from Minutes Board of Control Jan. 13, asking that the school Board pay accounts of W. E. Gates and W. J. Horton for appraisement of damages on schools, and recommend that as the Board did not authorize this appraisement made, that the accounts be not paid, and the Board of Control so informed.
- 3 They recommend that the chairman of this Committee be authorized to offer up to \$13,000 for the purchase of the King property for the site of Bloomfield School.
- 4 They recommend that the rental of West End Baptist Church Hall be increased from \$500 to \$600. per school year, such increase to date from Sept. 1, 1918 as requested.

Report to Supervisor

Medical Inspector

Use of Assembly Halls

Read letter Jan. 29 from E. A. Saunders, on behalf of the Civic Committee, asking for the use of Assembly Halls of the various schools of the city for the evening of Feb 11 for the purpose of holding meeting of citizens to discuss Civic Government.

On motion of Commrs. Warkely and De Wolf it was recommended that the request be granted, on condition that committee are responsible for any damage that may be done to buildings.

Bloomfield Site

On motion of Commrs. Fenlay and Guildford it was Resolved,

"That an application be made to the Governor in Council for its approval on contracts to purchase lots of land on Robie, Bloomfield & Agricola Sts. to provide a site to build a school building to replace that building known as Bloomfield Common School, destroyed by the Explosion of Dec. 6, 1917."

It was also on motion of Commrs. Fenlay and Bennett Resolved

"That an application be made to the Governor in Council for an order directing the City of Halifax to issue its debentures to the amount of Thirty six thousand, two hundred and thirty five dollars. (\$36,235.00) for the purpose of purchasing lots of land on Robie, Bloomfield & Agricola Sts. to provide a site to build a school building to replace that building known as Bloomfield Common School, destroyed in the Explosion of Dec. 6th."

Closing of Bloomfield St.

On motion of Commrs. Fenlay & Warkely the Acting Secretary was directed to write the Board of Control, stating that the School Board is making application to the Gov. in Council for the approval of purchase of lots of land
