6. They report having received a delegation consist-
ing of the Mayor, Controller Hines & Murphy, who
wished to have some of the items in the Maintenance
Estimate for the year ending April 30, 1920 taken care
of by a Short Term Loan. This Committee recommends
that though desirous of meeting the wishes of
the Board of Control in the matter of the Main-
tenance Estimate, finds itself unable to accede
to their request. The Committee is firmly of the
opinion that all of its Estimates on the Maintenance
Account are legitimately charged to Current
Account, particularly as such items have always
been so charged. The Committee further is of the
opinion that, while not in any way questioning
the good intentions of the Board of Control to
procure certain of the funds required by Short
Term Loans, such action will not be approved
by the Legislature, and is, moreover, a method
contrary to law as laid down in the City Charter
Section 901.
7. They recommend that the balance due Jacques
Broo for Heating contract, Ales. McKay School be
paid on certificate from the Architect.

Plans St. Patricks Boys School

Read telegram Mar. 15 from Wm Fraser, Toronto,
stating he was sending plans of Bloomfield St. Joseph's
School, also that he could prepare plans for St. Patricks
Boys School to cost \$9000 to \$10,000 per room. Filed

Read letter Mar. 17 from A.R. Bobb, architect, offering
to prepare plans for proposed St. Patricks Boys School,
making use of Richmond School plans, with alterations
for the sum of fifteen hundred dollars (\$1500.00)

On motion of commr. Finlay it was
Resolved that A.R. Bobb be engaged to prepare plans
for St. Patricks Boys School as per his offer, viz: \$1500.

On motion of commr. Finlay and Crosby, the Secretary
was instructed to make the usual applications to the
Governor in Council for approval of contract with
A.R. Bobb for preparation of plans for St. Patricks Boys
School at \$1500, and also for the Gov. in Council to direct the
City to issue debentures for same.
