Surplus on Appropriations

Read letter Mar. 19 from Bd. Controller asking for a detailed schedule showing the various balances to date in the items of School Board appropriations which have a known or anticipated surplus and also a schedule giving the surplus estimated to accrue in said items to the end of the financial year. Filed.

Fortnightly Club

Read letter Mar. 28 from Secy. Fortnightly Club, asking the Board to appoint two or more representatives to attend a conference to be held in Board of Trade Rooms, April 16th, respecting the need of a Public Library in Halifax.

On motion of Commrs. Hood & Guildford, Commrs. Crosby & Kelly were appointed as the representatives of the School Board at this conference.

Cable - Commr. Furness

Read cable from Commr. J. E. Furness, stating that owing to anticipated long absence from city, he deemed it his duty to resign as a member of the School Board.

On motion of Commrs. Finlay & Hood the Board declines to accept his resignation.

It was also on motion of Commrs. Kelly and Crosby, further resolved that a cable be sent to Commr. Furness, advising him that his services were desired by the Board when available.

Fire Insurance

Commr. Finlay reported that \$1600 had been received from Halifax Fire Ins. Co. for fire loss on Brunswick St. Annex to, and some had been placed in Insurance - St. Patrick's Boys School.

Daylight Savings

On motion of Commrs. Crosby and Kelly it was Resolved, "That in consideration of the business firms of the city adopting new time, that the School Board adopt Daylight Saving Time in schools, same to come into effect Monday, April 7, 1919.
