St. Patrick's Boys' School
Plans

Read letter, April 29, from the deputy Provincial Secretary enclosing order in Council, April 28, re issue of Debentures or Stock by the City of Halifax to raise the sum of \$1500 required by the School Board for the purchase of plans for the erection of St. Patrick's Boys' School.

On motion of Commrs Finlay and Dewolf the Board authorized the Committee on S.S. & B to follow the matter up

St. Joseph's - Land

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The Chairman of Committee on S.S.B. submitted a verbal request from Rev. C. E. McManus of St. Joseph's Church who wishes to purchase a strip of land 8' wide on the western line of land recently purchased to extend St. Joseph's School grounds. Council Finkay reported an interview with Rev. Fr. McManus in which he suggested a strip entering on Kaye St. that side being wider than the Russell Street land making the strip 11' on Kaye Street narrowing in to 8' be sold him for One Hundred and Fifty dollars.

On motion of Council Wood and Finkay the offer was approved and it was Resolved

That if Rev. C. E. McManus, Rector of St. Joseph's Church wishes to purchase the strip of land as above stated for One Hundred and Fifty dollars, the City Solicitor be instructed to prepare the necessary deeds.

Morris St School -

Charge for Rent to Relief Commission

A Committee consisting of the Chairman of S.S.B. and Council Wood, with the Supervisor was delegated to wait upon Mr. Rogers, Chairman of Relief Commission relative to payment of rent by the Commission for Morris St School when in use as a hospital, and Mr. Rogers' counter claim against the Board of Seven Hundred dollars for plumbing and electrical equipment.

The Committee reported having interviewed Mr. Rogers who stated that the Relief Commission had no intention of charging the Board with repairs and alterations to Morris St School to fit it for hospital purposes altho' the alterations had cost between \$25,000 and 30,000.

On motion of Councils Finkay and Wakely it was resolved that the amount of Seven Hundred dollars be withheld by the Commission from the Board's account in settlement of Relief Commission's claim for equipment in Morris St School.

Alexander McKay

Refuse left on Grounds

a complaint having been made that old radiators, piping and other refuse was still in the yard of Alexander McKay School, having been left after removal of Bunk house, it was Resolved, on motion of Councils Finkay and Wakely, to ask the Relief Commission to remove the piping and refuse and clear up the grounds.
