The Committee on School Sites and Buildings, just adjourned reported business transacted and recommendations as follows: -

Plans - Bloomfield - St Joseph's

That after having carefully considered the plans of eight architects for the new Bloomfield and St Joseph's Schools they recommend those of Mr Wm. Fraser under the nom de plume "Scotia" for acceptance

St. Patrick's Boys' School

They submitted a letter, Oct. 7, from Major H. C. Gates offering to sell the plans for St. Patrick's Boys' School, as prepared by him, for the sum of \$3000. - and recommend that he be offered \$2000. for them

Alexander McKay School Grading

That the attention of the architect of Alexander McKay School be called to the grading of the playgrounds

which is not yet commenced, and he be instructed to consult the Special Committee Comm^{rs} Colwell and Kelly.

Morris St. School Garage.

That it having been brought to the attention of this Committee that the person occupying premises adjoining Morris St Playgrounds had built a wooden garage having sole exit over the school grounds they had written the City Engineer who replied that plans had been submitted and a permit granted. They have further requested him to inspect the building and report whether it conforms to the plan.

Oxford School Fumigation

They report having received notice from the Secretary City Board of Health that Oxford School has now been thoroughly fumigated and have notified the contractors accordingly
