Background

 By-law M-200, "Standards for Residential Occupancies" focus on "Safe, Warm, Dry".

Improvements to the Bylaw focused on:

- Rental registry
- Strategic Inspections
- Safety requirements
- Community integration
- Accountability



Recommendation

• In 2016 Council directed staff to conduct a facilitated workshop with stakeholders for the purpose of developing a residential building licensing model.

Public engagement sessions facilitated by Stantec.



Council Direction

- In April 2019 council directed staff to:
- Draft amendments to By-law M-200, that include provisions for mandatory registration of rentals.
- Release M-200 violations to open data



Framework Progress

- Framework tasks split
- August 2020 Council approved amendments to the M-200 By-law (first reading)
- Council approved amendments to Administrative Order 15 (first reading)
- M-200 violation to open data in September



Amendments to M-200 By-law

Residential Rentals

New sections for rentals and Mini-Suites.

- Existing Rooming House Requirements adapted to apply to all rentals
- Changes, combined with registration, education, and inspections will equal safer rental accommodations.



Amendments to M-200 By-law

Residential Rentals

- Amended requirements will provide tenants and owners with a minimum safety standard.
- New provisions to improve community integration.

- Electrical

- Parking
- Noise
- Maintenance Provisions

Rooming Houses

 The requirement for Rooming House licensing was removed from the By-law.

Amendments to Administrative Order 15

Removal of rooming House licensing Fees

 The fee associated with the license (\$100 every two years) has been removed from Administrative Order 15.
