The proposed asking price for the building plus land is \$30,000. The building is approximately 33 feet by 45 feet and rests on a parcel of land, which is approximately 20,000 square feet in area.

The organizational arrangements as far as a Trustee-ship is concerned should be the responsibility of the Minister and the Deacons, with the costs involved (legal, etc.) to be deducted from the purchase price."

Considerable discussion ensued, and it was mentioned that the land, upon which the Church is built, is leased from the City of Halifax. It is to be noted that the lease is for a fifty year period and began in 1950.

It was the general feeling of the Committee that the asking price of \$30,000 was rather high and a suggestion was made that further discussions be held between City Staff and the Trustees of the Church in an attempt to negotiate a more realistic settlement.

The Committee agreed to the above course of action.
