

Prelim in ary Findings from IMW AH Needs Assessment Study

September 2020 - March 2021



- No sense of belonging and community "an invisible wall" felt by visible minority women
- Navigating and accessing available support systems
- Lack of services for women without Permanent Resident Status
- Lack of services for women who are recent arrivals and who have gained Canadian citizenship
- Cost of childcare vs. earning potential
- Underemployment
- Vulnerability for exploitation due to immigration status
