2. Relationship to Important Occasions, Institutions, Personages, or Groups



- Historical associations with architect Walter Johannes Busch
- Walter designed and built the residence in 1891; however, he did not personally occupy the dwelling
- The dwelling was leased out to various tenants from 1891 until at least 1942



2. Relationship to Important Occasions, Institutions, Personages, or Groups

3. Significance of Architect



- Built by Walter Johannes Busch (1865-1924)
- Trained under his father, esteemed architect Henry F. Busch
- Specialized in educational building design, including ten Halifax Schools.



4a. Architectural Merit (Construction Type)



- Two-storey, wood-framed dwelling with masonry foundation
- Reflects a common example of woodframing in Halifax

A) Construction type	Points
Very rare/ early example	7 - 10
Moderately rare/ early	4 - 6
Somewhat rare/ early example	1 - 3
Not rare/ common example	0



4b. Architectural Merit (Style)

- Example of the Late Victorian Plain style (1880-1915)
- Exhibits the style's trademark simple box form with flat roof.
- Character defining elements:
 - Simple box form;
 - Flat roof; and,
 - Single-leaf main entrance.

B) Style	Points
Very rare/ early example	7 - 10
Moderately rare/ early	4 - 6
Somewhat rare/ early example	1 - 3
Not rare/ common example	0




5. Architectural Integrity



Exterior	Points
Largely unchanged	11 - 15
Modest changes	6 - 10
Major changes	1 - 5
Seriously compromised	0



6. Relationship To Surrounding Area



- The immediate area contains several other homes built by Walter Johannes Busch or his father, Henry F. Busch
- This includes two registered heritage properties on North Street and the neighbouring property on Creighton Street



6. Relationship To Surrounding Area



 Generally, the property has historical, visual and physical associations with the neighbouring properties that are of a similar age and style.

Points	oints Comments	
6 - 10	The building is an important architectural asset contributing to the heritage character of the surrounding area.	
1 - 5	The Architecture is compatible with the surrounding area and maintains its heritage character.	
0	Does not contribute to the character of the surrounding area.	



Recommendation

It is recommended that should 2587 Creighton Street, Halifax, score more than 50 points on evaluation as a heritage property under HRM heritage property program, the Heritage Advisory Committee recommends that Regional Council:

- 1. Set a date for a heritage hearing to consider the inclusion of the subject property in the Registry of Heritage Property for the Halifax Regional Municipality; and
- 2. Approve the request to include 2587 Creighton Street, Halifax, in the Registry of Heritage Property for the Halifax Regional Municipality, as shown on Map 1, as a municipal heritage property under the Heritage Property Act.
