Whereas, 35 years ago, this month, Halifax Mayor Ron Wallace and Grand Chief Donald Marshall Sr., recognized Nova Scotia's first Treaty Day; and

Every year since, Nova Scotians mark Treaty Day, celebrating and recognizing the rich culture and important contributions of Mi'kmaq people; and

It is also the 28th anniversary of Mi'kmaq History Month; and

Halifax Regional Municipality strives to recognize the centuries-old treaties that have created an enduring bond of respect and friendship between Nova Scotia's Aboriginal and non-Aboriginal communities.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that, I, Mayor Mike Savage, on behalf of the Halifax Regional Municipality, do hereby proclaim October 1st, 2021, as Mi'kmaq Treaty Day in Halifax Regional Municipality, and further, extend Council's sincere best wishes to our Mi'kmaq Community as we mark this special milestone.
