2021-22 GSAR OPERATING GRANTS

There are four Volunteer Ground Search and Rescue (GSAR) teams in HRM that provide assistance to all three levels of government in the event of a missing person search, an evacuation, natural or man-made disaster, or evidence search. HRM Operating Grants are based on an average of three years of core recurring operating expenses and exclude search call-out claims that are reimbursed by the agent of jurisdiction. Here are the 2021-22 Operating Grant awards:

- Halifax Regional GSAR \$ 67,330
- Eastern Shore GSAR \$ 24,575
- Sheet Harbour & Area GSAR \$ 26,922
- Musquodoboit Valley GSAR \$ 16,300

• Plus a **Capital Grant of \$6,173 to the Halifax Regional GSAR** for the replacement and extension of their heating system in their facility.

BUS 401 ROUTE CHANGES - NOVEMBER 22nd

Starting on Monday, November 22nd, there will be some changes coming to Halifax Transit Bus Route 401 and its schedule that serves the Porters Lake, Lake Echo, East Preston and Westphal areas.

Due to low ridership, this bus route will no longer serve the communities of West Chezzetcook, Grand Desert and Seaforth. Instead, Bus Route 401 will service the Lakeview Shopping Centre and then will go up to and connect with Rural Express Bus Route 370 at the Porters Lake Park & Ride Terminal on Inspiration Way by Hwy 107, Exit 20.

This provides commuters with the option of free parking and then riding the bus. These adjustments will allow for new weekend service and more frequent weekday trips. For more info, visit: <u>www.halifax.ca/transportation/</u> halifax-transit/service-adjustments#Route401

HfxALERT is a mass notification system that HRM utilizes to provide timely alerts with important urgent and non-urgent information. It will strictly issue municipal notifications. These alerts may be urgent, such as evacuations, or non-urgent, such as overnight winter

WHERE ARE THE ILLEGAL DUMPS?

HRM is not responsible for removing illegally dumped material from private property. Any impacted property owner can place the dumped material roadside for collection on their regular garbage day or make their own arrangements for the material to be removed from their property.

With the new HRM Solid Waste regulations about illegal dumping with the "reverse onus" clause now in effect, the Municipality will be embarking upon an educational and enforcement program about waste diversion and alternative disposal methods. For example, small quantities of Construction & Demolition (C&D) materials can be placed by roadside as part of the regular residential collection. Furthermore, HRM is seeking specific location information of various illegal dump sites that plague our communities throughout the region. Please send me an e-mail with photos and precise information such as closest civic address or GPS Coordinates.

HRM is even looking at social media websites and apps such as <u>www.litterati.org</u> to map out and create an inventory of dumpsites.
