The cupboard is stocked on a regular basis and has been used respectfully since its opening earlier this Fall.


The cupboard is available 24/7 with a variety of non-perishable items.

HALIFAX TRANSIT INTERACTIVE ROUTE MAP



COGSWELL DISTRICT REDEVELOPMENT

Staff have presented three by-pass routes that will enable commuters to drive through the [Cogswell redevelopment](http://Halifax.ca/cogswell) area while avoiding the construction zone. The by-pass routes will be in use starting in spring 2022.

The Cogswell District project will more cohesively connect downtown Halifax, the north end, and the city's waterfront. Fully mobilized construction will begin in winter 2022. The construction phase of the project is expected to take up to four years to complete.

The Cogswell District project will:

- Convert 16 acres of road infrastructure into a mixed-use neighborhood, extending the entrance of the downtown northwards and reuniting communities separated by the interchange lands.
- Reinstate the urban street grid and create development blocks capable of supporting new residential and commercial environments for 2,500 people.
- Create high quality dedicated cycling lanes, multi-use trails, new parks and open spaces, a reimagined transit hub, and a significant central urban square will transform this traffic-centric area into a livable pedestrian friendly area for people to live, work, and play.

The completion of the Cogswell District project is expected to cost approximately \$122.6 million in

total. However, the project has the potential to be primarily self-funded in the long term once construction is over and the redevelopment of the area is completed.

EMERGENCY ACCOMMODATIONS



Updates are currently issued on a weekly basis to provide progress reports on efforts to establish emergency accommodations sites in Dartmouth and Halifax. These updates are part of HRM's ongoing efforts to ensure you are informed with the most up-to-date information.

2022/23 FISCAL FRAMEWORK



The [2022/23 Fiscal Framework report](#), presented to Regional Council on Tuesday,

November 23rd, contained recommendations for tax modifications to accommodate changing operational costs, capital investments, as well as debt and reserve changes including funding for current and new strategic initiatives. The Framework sets the broad, opening strategy for developing the initial municipal budget.

Detailed discussions, along with public input, will begin in February 2022. This will provide appropriate time for Regional Council to debate and adjust the budget over the coming months, with the final budget expected to be completed April 12, 2022.

Currently, staff are seeking direction regarding the development of the 2022/23 municipal budget. This includes a recommendation to increase the average

property tax bill for residential and commercial properties by 2.9 per cent. Additionally, a 3.0 per cent increase is being recommended as part of a new dedicated Climate Action Tax. If approved, the average property tax bill would increase by a total of 5.9 per cent. Council is looking for ways to lessen the increase and still accomplish our goals.

THE HEAT FUND

- \$29,000 for a 1-person household
- \$47,703 for a 2-4 person household
- \$67,937 for households with 5+ people

HRM COMMUNITY GRANTS PROGRAM

HRM's Community Grants Program offers funding for community projects led by registered, non-profit organizations and charities throughout the Halifax region. There are project grants of up to \$5,000 and capital grants of up to \$25,000.

The annual Christmas Tree lighting took place in the Grand Parade on November 27th with fireworks and a visit from Santa.


