<p><b>Subject: Proposal to host the Canadian Association of Police Governance (CAPG) 2024 Annual Conference</b></p>		
<p><b>Motion for Board of Police Commissioners to Consider:</b></p> <p>That the Board of Police Commissioners send a proposal to the Canadian Association of Police Governance expressing the Board of Police Commissioners' interest in hosting the Canadian Association of Police Governance Annual Conference in 2024.</p>		
<p><b>Reason:</b></p> <p>The Annual CAPG Conference brings together members of police governance boards and commissions from across Canada to participate in workshops and discussions focused on trends in policing and offers guidance and support so that participants can fulfill their role. Keynote speakers from across Canada, the US and around the world share experiences of successful programs that have created community and safety and well being for residents. Halifax has hosted this conference a number of times, most recently in 2014. Frequently the conference is held to coincide with the Canadian Association of Chiefs of Police (CACPP). There is potential for both conferences to be held back to back and to attract leaders in police governance, policing services, municipal, provincial and federal policing leaders and related industries.</p> <p>Discover Halifax has indicated support for the conference and expressed a willingness to work with the CAPG's national Executive Director to identify accommodation and hosting potential as well as cultural programs that may be organized during the First Nations Police Governance Conference held on the day before CAPG. The Nova Scotia Association of Police Governance has indicated it is interested in financially supporting the host sponsorship requirements and has indicated that other commissions in the province may share in the sponsorship support. If this proposal is accepted, there is a sponsorship fee of \$30,000. The first payment of \$5000 is to cover the cost of the final breakfast at the 2023 annual conference (location to be determined). The balance of \$2500 is due in 2024. As stated, the provincial NSAPG and other commissions in the province have indicated support to reduce this fee. CAPG will also require volunteer assistance with onsite registration, support for a partner program if it is to be offered and other local support as necessary. The conference agenda is determined by a conference committee that recruits and supports speakers and Halifax will be included in the committee with the opportunity to contribute ideas and local speakers as the program is developed.</p>
