### BIRD FEEDER REMOVAL

HRM staff are encouraging residents to remove bird feeders from their property to help stop the spread of avian flu and protect our local bird population. Nova Scotia is dealing with a deadly strain of avian flu in bird populations, and backyard bird feeders can facilitate the spread of it amongst wild birds. If you

encounter a sick or dead bird, do not touch it. **Please report it to the provincial Natural Resources Department at 1-800-565-2224.** While there is a very low risk of humans getting sick from avian flu, it's common sense not to handle sick or dead birds at any time.
