Changes to By-Law N-200: Construction Related Noise

Community Planning and Economic Development Standing Committee

Background

CPED & Council motions to consider:

- Potential changes to the Noise By-law (N-200) to better align prohibited times for construction related noise with reasonable standards when adjacent to residential areas (CPED, Dec. 2017)
- A permit process for temporary rock breaking/crushing, including environmental and noise related to rock breaking/crushing (RC, Jan. 2021)
- CPED recommendation report & request for supp. report (CPED, Sept. 29, 2022)



N-200 Construction Hours CPED Report (July 16, 2021)

Current Hours:

- 7:00 am to 9:30 pm (M-F)
- 8:00 am to 7:00 pm (Sat.)
- 9:00 am to 7:00 pm (Sundays and statutory holidays)
- exemptions for certain public agencies and their agents

Proposed Changes (July 16, 2021 CPED report):

Construction

 7 am – 8 pm (M-F), no change on weekends & holidays

Rock Breaking

- New definition
- 8 am 6 pm (M-F) ONLY

New Staff Exemption Process

- extended consecutive hours are required to complete concrete finishing or concrete pouring;
- a need to temporarily reduce noise impacts during the day as identified in the project's approved Construction Mitigation Plan under AO-2018-005-ADM; and
- there is limited access (seven days or less) to specialized trades or equipment.



Supplementary Report Request CPED Motion, Sept. 29, 2021

- Explores options to expand the notification area and communication methods for exemptions.
- Explores expanding or improving notification for blasting and construction-related noise that includes further communication to affected properties
- 3. Explores changes to weekday end-time hours (Monday to Friday) 9:00 p.m. for non-explosive rock-breaking.
- 4. Explores options for time reductions for non-explosive rock breaking.

Notification Area & Communication Methods for Exemptions

Proposed Notification:

- hand deliver written notice a minimum of 48 hours prior to commencing the work, to all property owners and businesses located within 30 metres of work site
- sign on-site and a website with e-mail contact or social media link
- notice must include reason for the exemption, duration, and contact information

<u>Supp. report:</u> provision that allows staff to require a larger notification area based on residential context and the type of exemption

Notification for Blasting and Construction-Related Noise

Current Notification:

- 300 metres from the Blasting Area & can be expanded by the Inspector
- notice must contain key contact information, the start of the blasting, duration, and location
- public information meeting may be required by the Inspector
- detailed notice to any school, hospital, or other health care facility within the notification area and at least 2 hours prior to each blast

<u>Supp. report:</u> no changes proposed due to existing discretion & variety of sites and contexts



Changes to Weekday End-time Hours (Monday to Friday) 9:00 p.m. for Non-Explosive Rock-Breaking

- only one municipality with rock breaking regulations permits rock breaking until 9 pm (5 pm or 6 pm is more typical)
- rock breaking noise levels considered to be "annoying" to "extremely loud" & take place over extended periods of time

Supp. report: maintain initially proposed hours of 8 am – 6 pm M-F & allow public works to continue rock breaking activities in the right-of way under currently permitted hours



Other Options for Time Reductions for Non-Explosive Rock Breaking

- Sundays & holidays are not recommended
- Saturdays from 8 am to 6 pm could be added to the proposed hours as an alternative

Other changes

- Maintain the currently permitted hours of 7 am to 9:30 pm Monday to Friday for general construction activities due to:
 - current pressures on the housing system and construction industry
 - additional impacts on the length and cost of construction projects
 - fewer complaints



Recommendation

It is recommended that the Community Planning and Economic Development Standing Committee recommend that Regional Council:

 Adopt the revised By-law N-207, amending By-law N-200 Respecting Noise, as set out in Attachment B of this report.
