










1. Age



 Present church building was constructed in 1929







2b. Historical Importance (Architectural Style)



- Constructed in the Spanish Mission Revival style
- Only example of this style in an ecclesiastical building in Atlantic Canada, and one of only few in Canada
- Defined by dual octagonal belltowers, decoratively shaped parapets, and use of round/roman arches in windows and mouldings.


3. Significance of Architect/Builder

- Designed by architect David Francis Saxton
- Locally significant with a career that spanned five decades (1920-1962) including work as a draughtsman, architect, and instructor
- Designed other locally-known buildings, some of which are still standing

4a. Architectural Merit (Construction Type)

- Heavy timber framed construction
- Exterior faced in white Dutch lap siding, wood-framed windows, and asphalt shingled roof

4b. Architectural Merit (Style)

- Spanish Mission Revival style, inspired by architecture of the Spanish Missions in California.
- Exceedingly uncommon in ecclesiastical buildings in Atlantic Canada. Many of the traditional Spanish Mission Style materials were translated to locallyavailable materials.
- Also present on the site is a pre-1845 statue of St. John the Baptist, brought from Rome





6. Relationship To Surrounding Area



- Church has been the tallest and most prominent architectural building in the neighbourhood
- Original Brae Burn Subdivision, created in 1914, is directly across from and intimately related with the former church building
- Neighbourhood and the church together represent a remarkably intact early 20th century neighbourhood.

6. Relationship To Surrounding Area

Points	Comments
6 - 10	The building is an important architectural asset contributing to the heritage character of the surrounding area.
1 - 5	The Architecture is compatible with the surrounding area and maintains its heritage character.
0	Does not contribute to the character of the surrounding area.

It is recommended that the Heritage Advisory Committee recommend that Regional Council:

- 1. Set a date for a heritage hearing to consider the inclusion of the subject property in the Registry of Heritage Property for the Halifax Regional Municipality; and
- 2. Approve the request to include 1102 Purcell's Cove Road, Halifax in the Registry of Heritage Property for the Halifax Regional Municipality, as shown on Map 1, as a municipal heritage property under the Heritage Property Act.
