NORTH WEST COMMUNITY COUNCIL UPDATES

On June 20th the North West Community Council (NWCC) considered the following:

<u>Case 23556: Amendments to the Sackville</u> <u>Drive Land Use By-law – Access to Multi-Unit</u> <u>Dwellings Across LS Zoned Properties</u>

NWCC voted to adopt the amendment to the Land Use By-law for Sackville Drive. The amendment includes that Access for Multiple Unit Dwellings constructed after May 7, 2002 shall be permitted over the Large Scale Commercial Zone through a registered easement no less than 3.0 metres wide.

Case 22820: Amendments to Development Agreement, Hanwell Drive (Sunset Ridge subdivision), Middle Sackville

NWCC approved this proposed amending development agreement.

Case 21826: Amending Development Agreement for 771-819 Bedford Highway and 12-32 Esquire Lane, Bedford JULY 2022 NWCC agreed to give notice of motion to consider the proposed amending development agreement to allow additional commercial uses, an expansion of the commercial area within existing buildings, construction of new motel buildings and accessory buildings, subdivision of the lands, and a reduction of the nondisturbance area, and schedule a public hearing.

CN ANNUAL VEGETATION MANAGEMENT



CN is advising of the commencement of their vegetation control activities that **will run between April and October 2022**. A regularly updated schedule is available at <u>www.cn.ca/vegetation</u>.

If not managed properly, trees, brush or other vegetation can severely compromise rail and public safety. Vegetation can impede the view motorists have of oncoming trains and increase the risk of crossing accidents. Moreover,

unwanted vegetation can damage the integrity of the railbed, interfere with signals and switches, contribute to track side fires, compromise employee and citizens safety, reduce visibility for train crews at road crossings/train control signals and track side warning devices, to name a few of the potential risks. CN's annual vegetation control program is designed to mitigate these risks by managing brush, weeds and other undesirable vegetation.


