- Introduced specialized inclusion workers to support summer camps and provided extended assistance to campers in need.

Training

- Adopted Angelfish training program for Aquatic programs
- Created trauma sensitive workshops and imbed information about trauma into our inclusion training
- Created universal program design workshop, offered to all program staff
- Ran staff through training developed by ISANS for Newcomers in Rec
