Subject: 2022 District Boundary Review Project – Final Report and Recommendation Process		
Motion for District Boundary Resident Review Panel to Consider:		
<p>That the District Boundary Resident Review Panel direct the Chief Administrative Officer to prepare a report with recommendations and rationale for amendments to the proposed mapping option developed by the District Boundary Resident Review Panel on September 14, 2022, based on the public engagement feedback from Phase Two.</p>		
Reason:		
<p>The public engagement campaign for Phase Two of the 2022 District Boundary project has closed and the responses provided by the public on the proposed polling boundaries that were developed by District Boundary Resident Review Panel are now being analyzed by Narrative Research. To ensure that the Panel is able to meet its objective of submitting its final report and recommendation to Executive Standing Committee by November 28, 2022, a staff report providing recommendations and a revised mapping option, for amendments to the proposed 16 polling district boundaries based on the public the feedback provided captured in the "What We Heard" report. The report will also provide the necessary rationale and justifications for these proposed amendments in accordance with section 368(4) of the Municipal Government Act. This course of action will ensure that necessary staff resources and subject matter expertise are available to the Panel when developing its recommendation to Executive Standing Committee.</p>		
Outcome Sought:		
<p>A staff report providing recommendations and a revised mapping option, for amendments to the proposed 16 polling district boundaries based on the public the feedback provided captured in the "What We Heard" report. The report will also provide the necessary rationale and justifications for these proposed amendments in accordance with section 368(4) of the Municipal Government Act.</p>
