January 18th is Winnie the Pooh Day

This day seeks to honor the designer of the character, Alan A. Milne. Winnie the Pooh is an anthropomorphic teddy bear created by Milne. Real-life Winnie was a female black bear that belonged to Harry Colebourn, who was from Winnipeg, Canada. He brought her to England, where he served during World War I. Winnie's permanent residence became the London Zoo where Milne visited her with son Christopher.

January 27th is International Holocaust Memorial Day

This day commemorates the millions of Jews and minority groups killed in the 1930s and 40s. The Holocaust was one of the most horrific genocides in history with an estimated 11 million lives lost. January 27th, the remembrance date, is significant as it was the date that Auschwitz-Birkenau, the largest and most infamous Nazi extermination camp in Poland, was liberated in 1945. In 2005, Holocaust Memorial Day was established by the <u>United Nations</u> General Assembly.

Braille is a tactile representation of alphabetic and numerical symbols that uses six dots to represent letters and numbers. It also includes musical, mathematical, and scientific symbols. It is named after its inventor - Louis Braille - who developed it from the military code called night writing, developed in 1819 by the French army

WINTER PARKING BAN

The municipal overnight winter parking ban is in effect annually from **December 15**th to **March 31**st. The ban is enforced from 1 a.m. to 6 a.m. during declared weather events and snow removal operations only. Sign up for

When will my road get plowed? STUDENT TRANSIT PASS – EXPANDED



Students at select high school and junior high schools will receive a free, annual Halifax Transit pass for use on buses, ferries and Access-A-Bus for 2023, through Phase 2 of the Student Transit Pass Pilot Program.

Participating schools and grades are:

- Woodlawn High School: Grades 10-12
- Dartmouth High School: Grades 9-12
- École secondaire du Sommet:Grades 9-12

- École secondaire Mosaïque: Grades 9-12
- Bicentennial School: Grades 7-9
- Caledonia Junior High: Grades 7-9
- Dartmouth South Academy: Grades 7-8
- Ellenvale Junior High: Grades 7-9
- Eric Graves Memorial Junior High: Grades 7-9
- John Martin Junior High: Grades 7-9

This pilot program, offered in collaboration with the Halifax Regional Centre for Education (HRCE) and the Conseil scolaire acadien provincial (CSAP) gives free annual transit passes to students, providing access to conventional buses, Access-A-Bus, and ferries. Halifax Transit will review the extended program in fall 2023 and provide recommendations to Regional Council on next steps for the program. For more information, visit our website.
