Property Assessment Notices were mailed out on Monday, January 9th. There is a 31day official Appeal Period from that date whereby property owners can review and perhaps refute their appraisals. You can now access your property file online. Your Notice will provide you with an AAN – Assessment Account Number with a PIN to view your data. If you feel it is not assessed properly, then you may contact the NS Municipality Agency - Property Valuation Services Corporation (PVSC) and speak with an Assessment representative.

NEW RULES: SHORT TERM RENTALS

HRM staff presented a comprehensive report with some recommendations on how to move forward with regulations on short-term rentals (STRs). There was two public surveys on this subject with the highest citizens response record on such surveys. Both HRM and the Province have been counselling with many other communities across the country to be more informed about their approaches to this issue. The HRM staff report was more about making the appropriate zoning amendments to allow STRs but it does make a strong recommendation that these types of tourism accommodations must be owneroccupied residences. This would eliminate those operators with multiple venues. However, there needs to be more clarification of STRs in a rural context where auxiliary secondary suites and RV campers are being used. The Province is expected to bring forth STRs tourism accommodation regulations and registry by Spring 2023.

HRM is also working on a Landlord Registry as well that could include STR operators. Plus, I wanted to see more information on fire safety enforcement, secondary suites options, property taxation implications and the administrative process for the collection of the Hotel Room Marketing Levy. HRM Staff have indicated it would take a couple of months to provide more details on the additional information requested.
