






Who Are We?

Residents will have a choice of **connected**, **healthy**, **affordable**, **sustainable** travel options for moving both people and goods.













HALIFAX ACTIVE TRANSPORTATION PLANNING & DESIGN PROCESS

1 - 2 Seasons

- Contracts & Permits
- Public and abutter notifications
- Project close out

Ongoing

- Communications launching facility
- On-going monitoring
- Year-round maintenance
- Asset management and rehabilitation





AAA Network Implementation Timeline

- By the end of 2023, cycling network will be ~60% complete
- New timeline to finish up final network segments extends to 2028.



AAA Cycling Network is 45% Complete (as of Feb 2023)






















AAA Network Status 2023 (planned)


Interim Bikeway Improvements

The municipality is planning to install 8.5 km of interim bikeway improvements between Fall 2022 and Spring 2023, using quick-build materials like concrete curbs, bollards, paint, and traffic calming features to make it easier and safer to cycle in Halifax and Dartmouth. These treatments will be in place until the streets can be permanently upgraded (likely within five years).

Where will these facilities be located?

Six routes have been selected in peninsular Halifax and Dartmouth within the Circumferential Highway. These represent important links in the AAA bike network that will promote connectivity and improved transitions between existing cycling facilities.




