SUBJECT: Funding for Canadian Alliance to End Homelessness Conference

ORIGIN

At the August 22, 2023, meeting of Regional Council, the following motion was passed (item 16.1):

That Halifax Regional Council direct the Chief Administrative Officer to prepare a staff report looking at options for providing municipal financial support to the Canadian Alliance to End Homelessness (CAEH) for their 2023 Conference taking place in Halifax November 8-10, 2023.

LEGISLATIVE AUTHORITY

Halifax Regional Municipality Charter, S.N.S. 2008, c. 39 as amended

79A (1) Subject to subsections (2) to (4), the Municipality may only spend money for municipal purposes if

- (a) the expenditure is included in the Municipality's operating budget or capital budget or is otherwise authorized by the Municipality;
- (b) the expenditure is in respect of an emergency under the Emergency Management Act; or
- (c) the expenditure is legally required to be paid.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that Halifax Regional Council:

- Suspend the rules of procedure under Schedule 2, the Audit and Finance Standing Committee
 Terms of Reference, of Administrative Order One, the Procedures of the Council Administrative
 Order, requiring the Standing Committee to review and make recommendations on proposed
 changes in any operating or project budget items;
- 2. Approve an unbudgeted reserve withdrawal from Reserve Q421;

3. Direct the Chief Administrative Officer to allocate up-to \$20,000 from the Options Reserve as sponsorship funding to the Canadian Alliance to End Homelessness Conference, taking place in Halifax this November 3rd to November 10th.

BACKGROUND

The Canadian Alliance to End Homelessness 2023 Conference will take place in Halifax from November 8, 2023 through to November 10, 2023. Previous year's conferences have seen over 1900 participants from across Canada. The conference will include 85 sessions from various experts from across Canada. The full details of the conference can be found in Attachment A – 2023 CAEH Conference Sponsorship Guide.

DISCUSSION

As outlined in Attachment A, the CAEH Conference has 5 different levels of sponsorship ranging from \$10,000 to \$100,000 with various benefits (including delegate passes) associated with each level of funding. A \$20,000 sponsorship would be a "Framing Partner", which would provide the municipality with 4 delegate passes, social media recognition and onsite signage.

Staff have not received a formal request from CAEH to provide a contribution toward the conference. Therefore, staff have assumed the event is fully funded. Typically requests to fund such events are made a year (or further) in advance to ensure that the budget is set appropriately to facilitate such funding.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

Internal options to obtain the \$20,000, include either using funding from within the existing operating budget or using reserves. Given that the Municipality is currently projecting some financial pressure as of the first quarter projections, the ideal funding source would be reserves. The appropriate reserve for sponsorship would the Options Reserve, Q421. The Options Reserve has sufficient funding as of the time this report with an uncommitted balance of over \$5 million.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

ALTERNATIVES

Regional Council could choose to:

- 1. Not approve the recommendation and opt-out of funding the Canadian Alliance to End Homelessness 2023 Conference.
- 2. Increase the funding level above the recommended \$20,000.




2022 Conference Stats

1921 from all provinces & territories + 7 countries




Organization/Occupation/Sphere of CAEH Conference Participants*
