Women's Safety Assessments

A tool for making public spaces safer for women, girls and non-binary people

What is a WSA?

The Women's Safety Assessment (WSA) is a participatory tool used to build safer neighbourhoods, schools, parks, campuses, workplaces, transit systems and other public spaces.

It brings together community members and other important partners to assess the space and make safety recommendations. It is grounded in women's, girls' and non-binary people's expertise from daily lived experiences of using, or choosing not to use, a space.



History of the WSA

Safety assessments were first developed in 1989 by the Metro Toronto Action Committee on Public Violence Against Women and Children (METRAC).

The tool builds on the best practices of Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (CPTED) and incorporates culturally competent, asset-based community development and gender-based approaches.
