ORIGIN

Applications received pursuant to Administrative Order Number 2014-021-GOV – Respecting Regional Special Events Grants.

LEGISLATIVE AUTHORITY

Halifax Regional Municipality Charter, S.N.S. 2008, c. 39 as amended

79A (1) Subject to subsections (2) to (4), the Municipality may only spend money for municipal purposes if

- (a) the expenditure is included in the Municipality's operating budget or capital budget or is otherwise authorized by the Municipality;
- (b) the expenditure is in respect of an emergency under the Emergency Management Act; or
- (c) the expenditure is legally required to be paid.

RECOMMENDATIONS

It is recommended that the Grants Committee recommend that Halifax Regional Council:

- 1. Approve 13 Event Grants (12 Community Celebrations and 1 Significant Anniversary) for a total of \$12,975 as identified in Table 2 from the approved 2024/25 Operating Budget C760 Events; and
- 2. Approve a supplementary grant withdrawal from the Community and Events Reserve (Q621) in the amount of \$13,000 to be allocated to "Open Streets HFX".

BACKGROUND

This report outlines the recommended Regional Special Events Grants awards for the 2024/25 funding intake. All Regional Special Events Grants recommendations are governed by Administrative Order 2014-021-GOV Respecting Regional Special Events Grants (AO). Staff undertakes the grant application and evaluation process as outlined in the AO. This Regional Special Events Grants report is reviewed by the Grants Committee for recommendation to Regional Council.

There are four established funding programs governed by the Regional Special Events Grants AO:

- 1) **Community Celebrations**: provides support for small scale community events that are organized primarily for the benefit and enjoyment of residents, coincides with a community gathering or civic holiday, and are free to the public to attend.
- 2) Established Community Events: provides support for existing community events that are organized primarily for the benefit and enjoyment of residents, are accessible to the public with free or low-cost activities, have been in existence for a minimum of three consecutive years, and have a minimum budget of \$10,000.
- **3) Significant Anniversaries**: provides support for community events organized around major quarterly anniversaries (25th, 50th, 75th, etc.) that celebrate HRM's heritage and community and have a minimum budget of \$7,500.
- **4) Cultural Events & Showcases**: provides support for arts and culture festivals that program strong cultural content, further the disciplines of literary, media, performing and visual arts, are accessible to the public with free or low-cost activities, have a minimum budget of \$50,000, and further the principles and objectives of the HRM Cultural Plan.

Program Allocations

The maximum grant amounts and total allocation for each of the programs are outlined below in Table 1:

Three-year Sustainable Funding

The Regional Special Events Grants AO provides the ability to award up to three-year sustainable funding to organizations under the Established Community Events and Cultural Events & Showcases programs. On May 17, 2022, Regional Council approved funding for these two programs awarding the full allocated budget for the 2022/23, 2023/24 and 2024/25 fiscal years preventing any public calls for application until the fall of 2024 to fund events happening in the next three-year funding cycle (2025/26, 2026/27, 2027/28). Events that receive multiyear funding are dependent on the approval of HRM's annual Operating budget and Community and Events Reserve.

The May 2022 Regional Special Events Grants staff report also noted the intent for the \$13,000 grant to Open Streets HFX from Community and Events Reserve (Q621) to be recurring subject to the continuation of this event.

Post Event Reporting

Events that receive Regional Special Events Grants are required to submit a final event report as part of the funding process within 120 days of the conclusion of the event describing the impact of the funding received from the Municipality. A final report form is provided by staff and is included with the awarding email, along with HRM Event Grant Agreement. The final event reporting provides information on the success and challenges associated with the event.

This is a key deliverable for Established Community Events and Cultural Events & Showcases that receive multiyear sustainable funding to ensure criteria are met and no significant changes have occurred. Any concerns are noted and will be brought forward to the Grants Committee for discussion. Failure to submit a final report within 120 days of the conclusion of the event will result in forfeiture of any remaining grant amount and ineligibility to receive future grants from the municipality. Upon receipt of final reporting, the organization will be eligible to receive future grants.

DISCUSSION

2024/25 Intake

There were 13 applications in total submitted during the 2024/25 only intake. These applications include: 12 Community Celebrations and one Significant Anniversaries. Information on the applications can be found in Attachment 1.

Eligibility

All 13 applications were deemed eligible and recommended for funding.

Evaluation

As per the Regional Special Events Grants AO, all applications are evaluated on:

- Community Engagement: evaluated based on volunteer involvement, diversity, accessibility, attendance and programming;
- Community Cultural Development: based on the provision of arts and cultural programming and experiences;
- Demonstrated Financial Need: evaluated on access to potential sponsorship, as well as the ability to self-fund; and
- **Demonstrated Added Value to the Community**: evaluated on the impact of the experience that would have otherwise not been available to the community in which the event is held.

The proposed Regional Special Events Grants funding amounts for the 2024/25 year are outlined in Table 2 below.

Sustainable Funding Year 3 of 3

2024/25 information for the 36 current Established Community Events (funded through C760), one Established Community Events (funded through Q621), and the 13 Cultural Events & Showcases (funded through Q621) all receiving their third and final year of three-year sustainable funding is included in Attachment 1. A summary of the combined 50 events receiving sustainable funding and grant amounts can be found in Attachment 2.

Since Regional Council's approval on May 17, 2022 to award three-year sustainable funding, three Established Community Events are no longer receiving funding and have been removed from the program.

- Bluenose Ability Arts & Film Festival was approved to receive a \$3,000 grant but did it not move
 forward with hosting an event, therefore no funding was released in 2022 or 2023 and has been
 removed from the program. Bluenose Ability Arts & Film Festival can apply for funding in future if
 the event returns.
- Community Dance was approved to receive a \$2,000 grant. After the submission of the 2022 final reporting, the event was in fact a fundraising event for the applicant which is deemed ineligible to receive funding as per the AO. The municipality did not request for the 2022 grant to be returned, the 2023 funding was not released, and the event has been removed from the program.
- Waverley Gold Rush Days was approved to receive a \$4,000 grant and signed the 2022 HRM
 Event Grant agreement which released 80% of the grant. All communications have ceased from
 the organization despite staff's several attempts to contact the organization regarding 2022 final
 reporting, as well as the status of a 2023 event. The 2022 remaining 20% of the grant was not
 released, nor was the 2023 grant and this event has been removed from the program. If final
 reporting is submitted and no longer has outstanding reports due, the organization may apply for
 future event grants.

2023/24 Post Event Reporting

Not all 2023/24 final event reports have been received; the majority are for events scheduled in the fall/winter and either have not yet taken place or are within the 120 days to submit their final report. Staff will continue to work with these organizations and ensure final reporting is received. There is ongoing communication and no immediate concerns with any of the organizations.

As the Regional Special Events Grants program has not been recently reviewed, staff intend to conduct a review of the program and return to the Grants Committee with findings and recommendations.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

The allocated allotment of \$215,000 to fund Community Celebrations, Significant Anniversaries and Established Community Events recommendations can be accommodated in the approved 2024/25 operating budget for Events, account C760-6919. All 2024/25 recommendations are subject to availability of funds and final approval of the 2024/25 Operating budget.

All Cultural Events & Showcases and two Established Community Events recommendations can be accommodated in the approved 2024/25 Operating budget C760 Events funded from the 2024/25

May 22, 2024

Community and Events Reserve Q621. All 2024/25 recommendations are subject to availability of funds and final approval of the 2024/25 budget.

There are no outstanding funds owing to the municipality by any of the recommended applicants.

RISK CONSIDERATION

There are no significant risks associated with the recommendations in this report. The risks considered rate low. To determine this, consideration was given to financial and reputational risk.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

Information regarding program eligibility and applicant timelines are posted on the HRM website. Staff contacted all previously funded Regional Special Events Grants recipients within the past year advising of the 2024/25 intake opening and deadline date. Communication is ongoing with program clients on the status of events.

ENVIRONMENTAL IMPLICATIONS

No environmental implications were identified.

The Grants Committee may choose to recommend that Regional Council amend the amount of any event grant in accordance with Administrative Order Number 2014-021-GOV – Respecting Regional Special Events Grants within the budget capacity of C760 and Q621.
