



Proclamation
Indigenous History Month & Indigenous People's Day
June 2024

WHEREAS, Indigenous Organizations & Royal Commission on Aboriginal People called for the creation of a day to celebrate Indigenous Culture & History across Canada since the 1990s;

In 1996, the Governor General of Canada, through a proclamation declared June 21st of each year as National Aboriginal Day. In 2009 the House of Commons passed a unanimous motion creating what was known as National Aboriginal History Month. In 2017, the Prime Minister issued a statement which announced the intent to rename the day as National Indigenous Peoples Day

In cooperation with Indigenous organizations, the Government of Canada chose June 21st, the summer solstice, for what is now known as Indigenous Peoples Day. This is a day for all Canadians to recognize and celebrate the unique heritage, diverse cultures and outstanding contributions of the First Nation, Inuit and Metis people.


