NWCC UPDATE

The North West Community Council (NWCC) reviewed the following matter at their July 15 meeting:

PLANAPP-2024-00177: Rezoning of 749 Windgate Drive, Beaver Bank

UPLAND Planning + Design, on behalf of the property owner, applied to rezone 749 Windgate Drive, Beaver Bank from MU-1 (Mixed Use 1) to I-1 (Mixed Industrial) to allow for an automotive repair and sales business use.

NWCC held and closed a public hearing on PLANAPP-2024-00177 with NWCC approving the rezoning for 719 Windgate Drive from MU-1 to I-1.

EMANCIPATION DAY



In 2021, Nova Scotia officially designated August 1 as Emancipation Day, a time to reflect and acknowledge our shared history of the enslavement of people of African descent in Canada.

On August 1, 1834, the Slavery Abolition Act of 1833 became law, officially ending the practice of slavery across the British Empire.

Slavery was foundational in the systemic anti-Black racism that impacts people of African descent today. Recognizing Emancipation Day provides an opportunity to maintain ongoing meaningful dialogue around race relations and inclusion, and to celebrate the diverse heritage, culture and contributions of people of African descent across the region.

These service providers include BayRides, East Hants Community Rider, MusGo Rider Eastern Shore, and MusGo Rider Valley Sheet Harbour.





RCMP STATISTICS - JUNE



FALL RIVER ROAD - HIGHWAY #2- UPDATE



HRM has experienced instances of heavy precipitation events that have impacted the drainage system at Highway 2 in Fall River between Miller Lane and Collins Drive. A hydrologic and hydraulic study of the area was conducted by Dillon Consulting in 2023. The study refined the area into eight drainage systems to explore in additional detail. From that study, upgrades to three drainage areas were recommended: drainage system C, drainage system E, and drainage system H.

<u>Drainage System C: Holland Rd to Howe Ave</u>
It is proposed that the existing 750 mm diameter concrete outfall pipe be increased to a 1200 mm diameter concrete pipe. In addition, the piped storm sewer within the roadway should be increased to convey flow to the outfall.

Drainage System E: Coach Ave to Civic # 3476

It is proposed that storm sewer be upgraded to 750 mm diameter pipes and an additional 750 mm diameter cross culvert be added to accommodate runoff.

<u>Drainage System H: Fall River Rd to Miller Ln</u> Recommendations for drainage system H include upgrading the storm sewer between Fall River Road and Miller Lane.

The potential timeline for work on the Fall River Road Disaster Mitigation and Adaption Fund (DMAF) projects is planned for the 2026/27 construction season. It would be an integrated project with storm water upgrades and, if feasible, Active Transportation. The full scope of work and timeline will not be determined until detailed design work is underway.

The municipality is responsible for the section of Highway 2 that starts after the Inn on the Lake to Sobeys on Fall River Road. The province is responsible for the off/on ramps, roundabout, and the area under the overpass until north of Inn on the Lake.

Until the capital and DMAF work is complete, HRM's Infrastructure, Maintenance & Operations team will respond to work orders within standards. In May, the team repaired three priority potholes near Inn on the Lake. There is an open work order to complete 250 sqm patching opposite civic 3124. The team continues to inspect the area every seven days and will report priority repairs as they are discovered.

ROAD SAFETY STRATEGY



Regional Council has adopted the <u>Road Safety</u> <u>Strategy 2024</u> to reduce fatalities and injuries on roadways in the municipality.

Operating on the principles of Vision Zero and Safe System Approach, this strategy seeks to address road design that has vulnerabilities and the potential for human error. The strategy identifies four priority areas: intersections, vulnerable road users, safe schools and data management.

Regional Council has also directed staff to provide annual reports regarding the actions outlined in the program. For more information, click here to read the staff report.

Regional Council has approved the road safety action plan to address ten intersections in the municipality with the highest number of fatal and injury collisions.


Current data shows that half of all collisions resulting in fatalities and injuries take place at intersections, with the majority taking place at collector or arterial roadways. As outlined in the Strategy 2024, intersections have been identified as a priority. These projects will be a major focus of the road safety program.



TRAVELLER OPINION SURVEY



The Halifax Regional Municipality is asking residents to provide feedback on how they travel throughout the region in the <u>latest Traveller</u> <u>Opinion Survey</u>.

Open until August 12, the survey is used to measure residents' perception of our existing transportation network (walking/rolling, bicycling, transit and driving). It helps the municipality learn more about how and why residents travel, as well as understand what motivates people to use sustainable transportation modes.

This year's <u>survey</u> will help set the future framework for sustainable transportation in the Halifax region as the most recent survey was completed in 2019 and the way many people travel each day has changed significantly since the pandemic.

The <u>Traveller Opinion Survey</u> stems from the municipality's <u>Integrated Mobility Plan</u> (IMP). Endorsed by Regional Council in 2017, the IMP creates a vision for moving people and goods around the Halifax region and seeks to improve the links between residents and their communities.

The 2024 <u>survey</u> will help record and track public perception and awareness of available sustainable transportation options. The results will be compared to the 2019 survey to measure progress.

FALL RIVER DRAGONS FOOTBALL



I was proud to present a District 1 District Capital Fund cheque to the Stewart brothers representing the Fall River Dragons to assist with the purchase of football equipment.

Over the last twelve months, the Fall River Dragons resumed operations after being inactive for a few years. A board was elected to get things going and this dedicated group faced many hurdles after such a long absence from the league.

With aging equipment and no fundraising activities for a few years, the board had their August 2024

work cut out for them. Through hard work and the unwavering belief that our community really needed a minor football program, they were able to field two of the four teams, Mites and Peewee.

Their efforts were focused on re-establishing operating procedures, recruiting players to field teams, fixing aging equipment, finding coaches and securing the funds to run a season. The board successfully tackled the daunting tasks and for that we are grateful!

Most of the board members had committed for only a year to get things up and running. Thats where the new board comes in. In April 2024, a new board was elected to revitalize and ensure the proud tradition of Dragons Football carries on with the ability to provide the youth in our communities the opportunity to participate for years to come.

The new board quickly got to work on the following priorities:

- an in-depth look at equipment resulted in the realization that much of it had expired, was in poor shape and not safe to use.
- financial reserves were nil due to inactivity for a few years necessitating active fundraising.
- adding to the financial challenge was the decision to field two additional teams, Atom and Bantam, requiring more equipment and volunteers.
- FaceBook page, website and branding have been updated, refreshed and the response from the community has been positive over the last several months – proof that reflects the enthusiasm and

dedication to offer a quality, inclusive program.

The Dragon's Association strives to keep registration fees reasonable and is amongst the lowest in the league. After player insurance, league fees, officiating fees and field rental costs are subtracted, it doesn't come close to covering a set of gear for a player.

The board is committed to giving every youth an opportunity to try football even if the family is not able to afford it.

Through a lot of hard work and generosity of sponsors, \$35,000 in funding was raised which enabled the purchase of 78 helmets and 41 sets of shoulder pads!

Fundraising is ongoing to purchase football pants and jerseys that are needed before the season commences. Nothing is impossible if you are willing to put the work in!

One disappointment was the inability to field a Bantam team due to low registration numbers. This is now a priority of the board moving forward.

The Dragons Association provides youth sport programs to Fall River, East Hants, Beaver Bank, Waverley, Wellington and Enfield to name a few

The Dragons organization want to thank and recognize all the volunteers, board members, community, sponsors, governments at various levels, players and parents who supported them over the last twenty years. They are diligently working on being around for another twenty!

Aerotech Connector route

At the July 25 <u>Transportation Standing</u> <u>Committee meeting</u>, I submitted a request, through committee member Councillor Waye Mason, for a staff report regarding potential rerouting of the 320 to stop in the core of Fall River on Highway 2 near the Fall River Road intersection using a new route via the soon to open <u>Aerotech Connector</u> and Highway 112 Exit 14.

The Aerotech Connector, a provincial Department of Public Works connection between Exit 5A at Highway 102 and Trunk 2 in Wellington, is expected to be open by end of December 2024.

HRM has acquired land across from the Sobey's on Fall River Road that could potentially be used as a transit stop.




