Halifax Independent Civilian Review Into August 18 2021 Encampment Evictions

# **August 18, 2021**

- HRM Parks and Recreation staff, HRM Compliance Officers, and Halifax Regional Police took steps to clear four encampments;
  - Horseshow Island
  - Peace and Friendship Park
  - Halifax Common
  - Memorial Library

BOPC Review – Actions of August 18, 2021



### **Terms of Reference**

- The adequacy of the Board's existing policies
- The adequacy of HRP's priorities, objectives and goals as they relate to the eviction of unhoused people
- The adequacy of oversight and governance mechanisms employed by the BoPC

#### **General Recommendations: BoPC**

- Adopt a more assertive role in overseeing the HRP, including by
  - Ensuring the Chief keeps the board apprised of important HRP operations before and after events unfold
  - Identifying a process to review BoPC and HRP policies
- Identify BoPC policy gaps, including in the areas of
  - Policing encampments and the unhoused
  - Human rights
  - Use of Force and pepper spray
  - Defining what constitutes a "critical point"
- Acknowledge the distinct needs of traditionally underserved communities

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#### **General Recommendations: BoPC**

- Issue apology for flaws in decision-making process that led to evictions (in conjunction with HRM)
- Establish committee with representation from HRP, BoPC, unhoused people and social service agencies
- Revise training modules, Operational Plans, detention procedures and role of Commanding Officer
- Review policies related to officer identification, Use of Force and Sensory Irritants

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#### **General Recommendations: Council**

- Continue to designate appropriate public spaces for encampments and only consider eviction in non-designated sites as last resort
- Improve communication with encampment residents:
  - If an encampment is cleared, ensure a Notice is issued with information about their options and what to expect
  - Ensure a variety of communication methods are used
  - Ensure social service agencies are also provided information
- Review the resources provided to support the unhoused community
