St. Margaret's Bay Road Work

The current project on St. Margaret's Bay Road (Brentwood Ave-Maplewood Drive) is ongoing with asphalt repair, sidewalk, curb/gutter, guiderail, asphalt trail/parking lot paving and landscaping. We currently do not have an exact date for completion due to unforeseen challenges with this project. The full height curb in front of Fitzgerald's store has been removed and the parking lot is one large opening as it was prior to construction.

Traffic Signals on Timberlea Parkway

The installation of traffic signals at the bottom of Timberlea Parkway has been delayed until spring 2025. This is due to delays with utility relocations.

Lakeside Community Centre Update

Work is progressing on the new community centre and it is currently scheduled to open in the summer of 2025. The official opening of the centre will depend on when programming



can begin. I will be sure to advise when the date has been finalized.

During construction, recreation programs continue to take place at 1300 St. Margaret's Bay Road, neighborhood schools and the firehall. Further information can be found on our website.

Construction on Parkland Drive

I have received many inquiries regarding the work on the property across from 767 Parkland Drive. Staff have confirmed there is a permit application for a Single Unit Dwelling at this site, however the permit is incomplete and has not been reviewed by a Planner or Building Official yet. Updates on the status of the permit can be viewed on HRM Open Data here. I have been told that there is other activity taking place on this property and a Municipal Compliance case has been opened to investigate. I will provide updates on this site as they become available.

Thomas Raddall Drive Shelter Village Update

The Provincial Department of Community Services' construction of the Shelter Village at

Thomas Raddall
Drive is now
underway. This
village will provide
temporary housing
solutions for people
experiencing



homelessness. They also provide case management 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. There will also be fencing and on-site security and security cameras.

The village will consist of 40 residential units along with several other buildings that will include bathrooms, showers, laundry service, and communal space. The Shelter Village will be run by the Atlantic Community Shelters Society. As soon as an opening date is finalized that will be announced by the Province.

EV Chargers at the Canada Games Centre

New EV chargers at the Canada Games Centre parking lot are expected to be available soon. The chargers will include both level 2 and level 3 charging. There will be user fees for public EV charging stations that will be owned and operated by the municipality. The fees are set at \$0.03 per minute for level 2 charging and \$0.75 per minute for level 3 charging and were designed to cover ongoing fixed and variable operational costs of the chargers.

New Crosswalk Installations

Exciting news! A new crosswalk was installed on November 4 at Barkton and Radcliffe. You will also see a new crosswalk on Parkland, near Belcher's Marsh Trail. The crosswalk was installed this past Sunday, December 1, and will have Rectangular Reflective Flashing Beacons (RRFB's) to enhance visibility to motorists. The RRFB's will be installed at a later date.

NATIONAL DAY OF REMEMBRANCE AND ACTION ON VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN

On December 6, we recognize The National Day of Remembrance and Action on Violence Against Women – commemorating the 1989 École Polytechnique massacre where 14 women lost their lives. We honour them by observing a moment of silence at 11 a.m. and wearing a white ribbon if possible.


AUTOMATED CART COLLECTION SURVEY

As part of the ongoing efforts to improve waste management and enhance community services, the Halifax Regional Municipality is exploring a cart-based collection system for garbage, similar to the green cart program for the collection of residential organics.

If implemented, each household would receive a wheeled cart specifically designed for garbage disposal. On collection days, residents would place their carts at the curb, where trucks equipped with hydraulic arms will lift, empty, and return the carts.

Cart-based collection for recycling (i.e., blue carts) is not part of this current evaluation. Under Extended Producer Responsibility (EPR), the delivery of curbside recycling collection will shift from the municipality to the producers of blue bag material, commencing in December 2025.

A survey to gauge public interest and support will be available until December 20. The results of the survey will be used to inform a 'Garbage/Organics Automated Cart Based Collection Implementation Plan' which staff will present to Halifax Regional Council in Spring 2025. HOUSING ACCELERATOR FUND

In May 2024, Regional Council approved amendments to legislation to support more options for housing across the region and to advance HRM's application under the Housing Accelerator Fund. The Province approved these changes on June 13.

These changes were made to respond to our growing population and the urgent need for housing among our residents. They enable a minimum of four units per lot in all residential zones within urban areas.

SENIORS CARE GRANT

The Seniors Care Grant helps low-income seniors with the cost of household services like lawn care, snow removal, grocery delivery, transportation, small home repairs and phone service, healthcare services like physiotherapy and mental health support and home heating. Grants are \$750 for each household. You can find out more information and the application form here.

VOLUNTARY VULNERABLE PERSONS REGISTRY

The Voluntary Vulnerable Persons Registry (VVPR) is a self-referral list for residents of the

Halifax Regional Municipality who may require support during emergency situations. The VVPR provides important



information to Emergency Management staff, volunteers and, first responders to help appropriately respond to resident needs in situations such as sustained power outages, severe storms, and more.

Registering for the VVPR is voluntary and easy and starts by completing an intake form. Visit our website or call 311 to get started. The Voluntary Vulnerable Persons Registry is for residents without 24-hour support who experience severe difficulty with any of the following: mobility, vision impairment, hearing impairment, developmental disabilities, cognitive impairment, mental health conditions, or, any resident who requires electricity for lifesustaining equipment such as oxygen, dialysis, etc.

SNOW CLEARING

While the snow hasn't started to fly yet, I would encourage you to begin preparing your property for snow clearing season by removing planters, lawn decorations and any other portable objects near the sidewalk and trimming any tree branches and shrubs that originate from your property that may obstruct access and visibility for snow-clearing equipment. You can mark any permanent structures or objects with a reflector that will be visible above the snow. This helps crews identify obstacles.

Effective December 15 to March 31, the municipal overnight winter parking ban will be enforced from 1 a.m. to 6 a.m. during weather events and snow removal operations. You can sign up for hfxALERT to receive crucial updates, including Winter Parking Ban notifications.

During snow events, all our equipment and operators work as quickly as possible to clear roads and sidewalks as efficiently as possible. If the <u>service standard</u> has expired for your street to be cleared, please contact 311 and they can dispatch a plow. Before the service standard has expired, please be patient and give our crews time – we are working as quickly as we can. You can find out what classification your street is by searching on our <u>interactive map</u>.

Let's work together to ensure a safe and smooth winter season for everyone in our community. Stay warm and stay safe!
