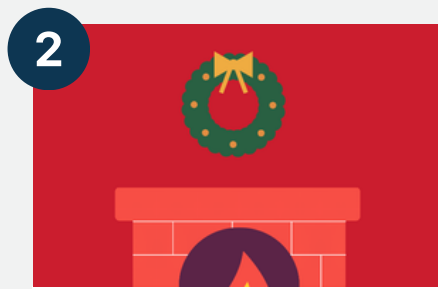

Have your fireplace inspected and cleaned before lighting a fire this season.

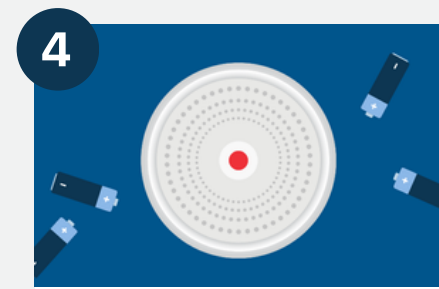
A clean fireplace means a safe and cozy season.

Keep decorations off sprinkler systems.

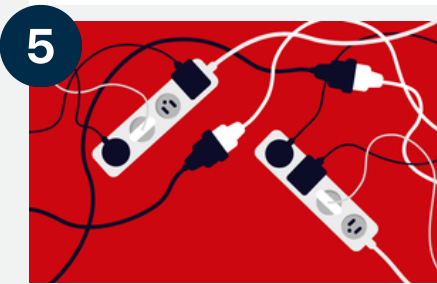
Decorations can block or damage fire safety sprinkler heads.

Matches and lighters should be stored out of reach and locked away.

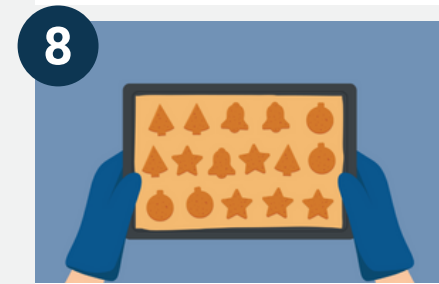
Out of sight, safe and secure.

Always use outdoor-rated lights outside; they're made to withstand the elements.

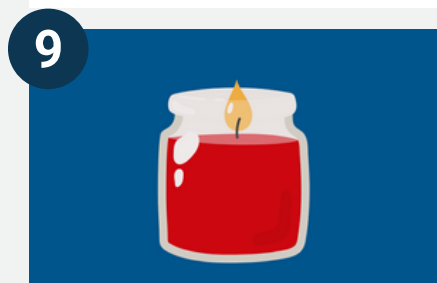
Brighten up your holiday safely.

Always have a designated cook in the kitchen.

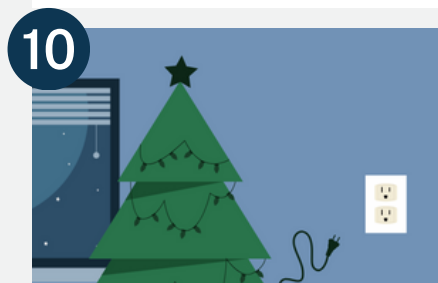
Keep holiday treats safe and sweet.

Turn off holiday lights before bed.

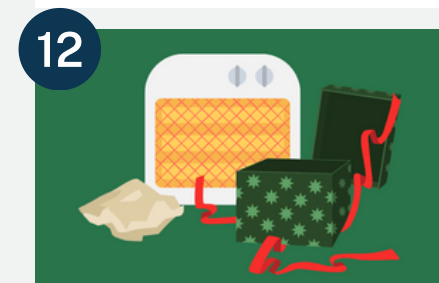
Rest easy with safety in mind.
