- Enhance the services provided by police to victims
- Provide a coordinated response to victims in cooperation with community agencies
- Increase awareness of victims issues and community based services through education
- Increase supports and healing for victims through research and education

- Other victims as referred by Officers



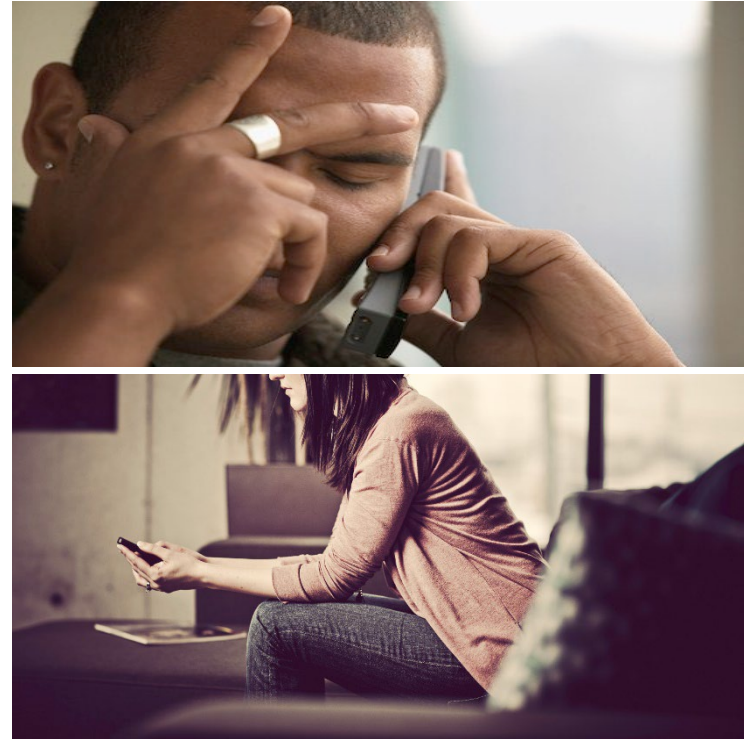
What do we do?

How Do We Get Referrals?

- Automatically by Police Reports
- Direct referrals by Police Officers
- Clients initiate contact
- Community agencies
