





Bike Racks on Buses

Each bus is equipped with a bike rack which can hold a maximum of two bikes. Regular and ebikes are permitted; gas-powered bikes are not. Batteries on ebikes must remain connected to the ebike. You are responsible for both loading and unloading your bike.


